## CHAPTER 1787

No. 448 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF A  
CERTAIN QUESTION TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY.

Approved September 7, 1966

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State is hereby requested to submit  
the following question to the qualified electors of the City of Providence  
on Tuesday, November 8, 1966:

"Shall the City of Providence be authorized to issue bonds  
in a sum not exceeding TWO MILLION FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND (\$2,400,000)  
DOLLARS, for the construction, reconstruction, furnishing and  
equipping of public school buildings in said City?"

SEC. 2. The City Clerk is directed to transmit to the Secretary  
of State forthwith upon the passage of this ordinance, a certified copy  
thereof.

SEC. 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 400

Approved September 7, 1966

WHEREAS, Section 301 of the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-136, 89th Congress), authorizes the Administrator of the Economic Development Administration to provide direct Technical Assistance to cities for preliminary design planning and feasibility studies of development facilities, and

WHEREAS, the City of Providence deems it necessary and in the public interest to undertake a feasibility study and financial analysis for a Providence, Rhode Island Convention Center-Sports Arena Complex in order to break the current impasse to the construction of this essential facility, and

WHEREAS, the City of Providence desires the Mayor of Providence to apply for Technical Assistance under Section 301 of the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 for the carrying out of said study, and

WHEREAS, said Section 301 of the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 provides that the federal share of such assistance may be 100% of the estimated cost of such activities or undertakings as determined by the Administrator.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Providence as follows:

1. It is hereby found necessary and in the public interest to make application to the Economic Development Administration for Technical Assistance under Section 301 of the Public Works and Economic Development Act of 1965 (Public Law 89-136, 89th Congress) for the aforementioned assistance.

2. The Mayor of the City of Providence is hereby authorized and designated as the Representative of the City for the filing of an application with the Economic Development Administration for said Technical Assistance, to cause to be prepared all documents necessary for said Technical Assistance, and all work necessary to carry out the terms of any contract by the City and the Economic Development Administration arising out of said application for Technical Assistance.

Approved September 7, 1966

WHEREAS, the Twenty First National Conference on Citizenship will be held in Washington, D. C. during the period of September 11th to the 14th 1966, and

WHEREAS, in times, such as the present, the privilege of citizenship in the United States of America is undeniably a freedom so valuable that this Nation's armed forces have marched with honor and glory to defend; and

WHEREAS, protected by articles of the Constitution of the United States of America, American citizenship is unquestionably membership in the greatest Nation in recorded history.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That His Honor Joseph A. Doorley, Jr., Mayor of the City of Providence, Rhode Island and the Members of its City Council do hereby individually and severally endorse the aims and purposes of the National Conference on Citizenship and further wish that its proposed Twenty-First Annual Meeting, scheduled most appropriately to be held in the Nations Capitol, reaffirms the principles of freedom of the rights and privileges the United States of America grants its law abiding citizens; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That upon the adoption of this Resolution by the City Council and approval by His Honor the Mayor, the City Clerk is directed to transmit to Mr. Justice Tom C. Clark, as President of the National Conference on Citizenship, a duly engrossed copy of this Resolution.

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 453

Approved September 7, 1966

RESOLVED, THAT His Honor, the Mayor be and he hereby is authorized to execute a lease to Brewster Building Materials Co., Inc. of certain tracts of land situated on the easterly side and westerly side of Shipyard Street for a term of five (5) years with option to renew said lease for three (3) additional five (5) year terms at an annual rental of .036 cents per square foot for land on the easterly side of Shipyard Street and at an annual rental of .05 cents per square foot for land on the westerly side of Shipyard Street during the first two (2) five (5) year terms and at an annual rental of .046 cents per square foot for land on the easterly side of Shipyard Street and at an annual rental of .06 cents per square foot for land on the westerly side of Shipyard Street during the third five (5) year term; and at an annual rental of .056 cents per square foot for land on the easterly side of Shipyard Street and at an annual rental of .07 cents per square foot for land on the westerly side of Shipyard Street during the fourth five (5) year term; and upon such other terms and conditions as may be approved by the Mayor and the City Solicitor; subject however to the condition that upon relocation of Shipyard Street appropriate adjustment shall be made for the rental of land abutting the relocated street.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that His Honor, the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized to grant to Brewster Building Materials Co., Inc., option to lease a tract of land situated on the westerly side of Shipyard Street adjacent to and abutting the land presently leased by Brewster Building Co., Inc.; said option shall be for a term of one (1) year at the rate of .02 cents per square foot per year. If Brewster Building Co., Inc. elects to exercise this option then the terms and conditions of said lease shall correspond to the terms and conditions of the inclusion in this resolution for land on the westerly side of Shipyard Street.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Resolution No. 354, approved July 11, 1966, is hereby repealed.

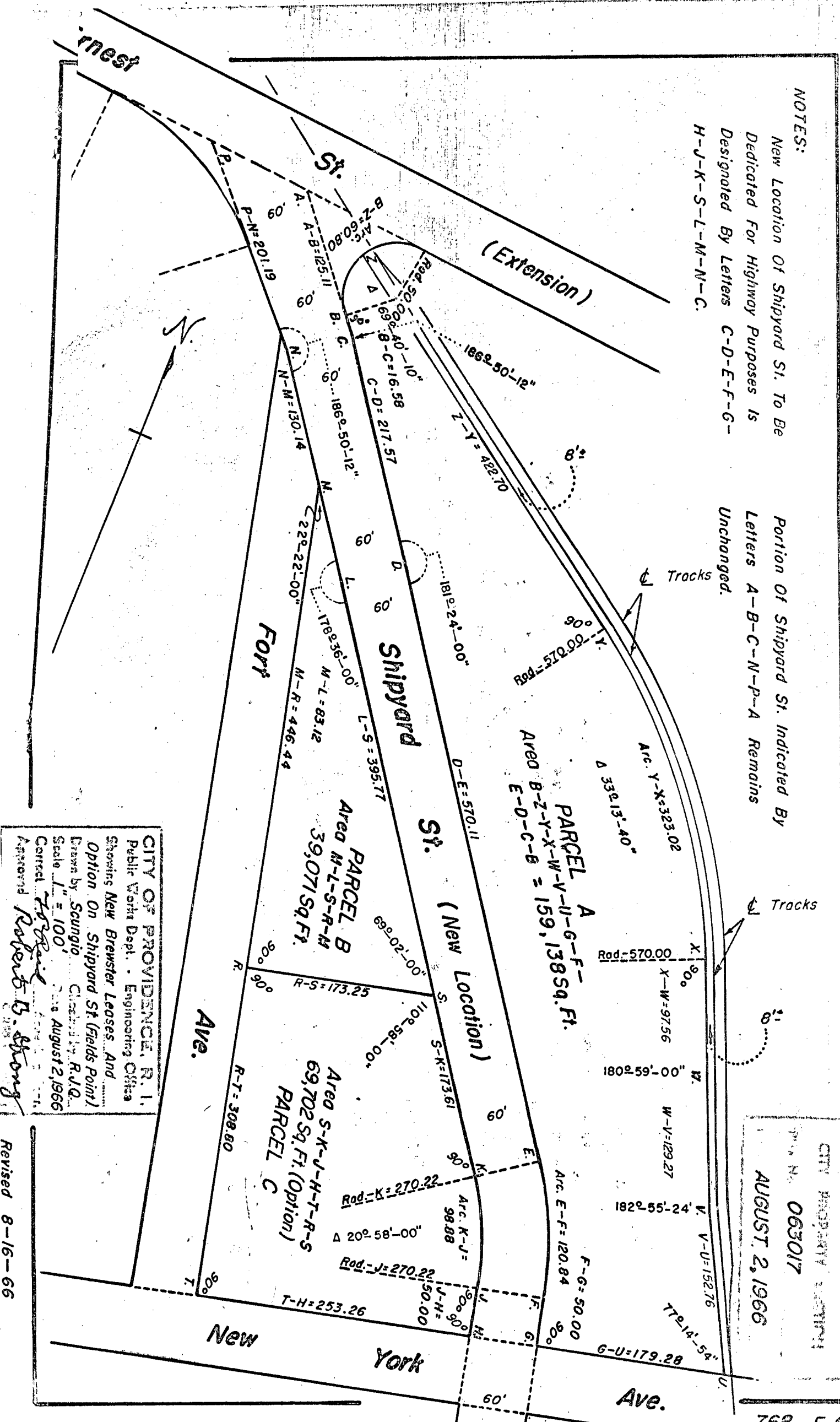
