It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 42-28-46 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-28
2 entitled "State Police" is hereby amended to read as follows:

3 42-28-46. Development of system monitoring crimes motivated by
4 bigotry and bias. -- (a) For the purposes of this section, the follow-
5 ing words shall have the following meanings:

6 (1) Police department - all state, municipal and campus police
7 departments within the state of Rhode Island.

8 (2) Hate crime -- any crime motivated by bigotry and
9 bias, including, but not limited to threatened, attempted, or completed
10 acts that appear after investigation to be motivated by racial, reli-
11 gious, ethnic, gender or handicap prejudice.

12 (3) Hate crime data -- information, incident reports, records and
13 statistics relating to hate crimes, collected by the state police unit
14 pursuant to this section;

15 (4) Incident report -- account of any individual occurrence of
16 hate crime received or collected by the crime reporting unit pursuant
17 to this section.

1 **(b) The state police shall, by January 1, 1989, 1994 develop a**
2 **system monitoring the occurrence of crimes committed in the state**
3 **which the evidence of the offense demonstrates was motivated by**
4 **racial, religious, or ethnic bigotry, or bias on any other matter de-**
5 **finied as a "hate crime" herein. All police departments within the**
6 **state shall report monthly the occurrence of such crimes to the state**
7 **police. The state police shall maintain a permanent record of these**
8 **offenses categorized by community of occurrence, type of offense,**
9 **target of offense and such other information as the department deems**
10 **relevant. The department shall develop a plan for the collection,**
11 **analysis, and dissemination of the data regarding such crimes, and**
12 **shall promulgate regulations relating to the collection of hate crime**
13 **data, as defined in this section, which are submitted by law enforce-**
14 **ment agencies, individuals, state and local human rights commissions,**
15 **and anti-discrimination advocacy organizations.**

16 **Said regulations should include, but not be limited to, the fol-**
17 **lowing:**

18 **(1) Establishment of a central repository at the state police for**
19 **the collection categorization and analysis of information regarding**
20 **incidents of hate crime in the state.**

21 **(2) Procedures necessary to ensure effective data-gathering and**
22 **preservation and protection of confidential information, and the dis-**
23 **closure of information in accordance with this section.**

24 **(3) Procedures for obtaining incident reports regarding all hate**
25 **crimes as described in this section.**

26 **(4) Separate maintenance and clear identification within the**
27 **state police of hate crime data acquired from law enforcement agen-**
28 **cies and of data from non-law enforcement sources.**

29 **(c) The criminal reporting unit should summarize and analyze any**
30 **hate crime data coming into the possession of said unit. Said unit**
31 **shall transmit copies of all incident reports to the attorney general.**
32 **The criminal reporting unit should also file an annual report regard-**
33 **ing hate crime data with the governor, the attorney general, the house**

1 and senate judiciary committees, and the senate and house finance com-
2 mittees. These annual reports should be made available to the public.

3 (d) The crime reporting unit should cause any hate crime data
4 collected in accordance with this section to be made available for use
5 by other law enforcement agencies investigating "hate crimes". Dis-
6 semination of such information shall be subject to all confidentiality
7 requirements otherwise imposed by law.

8 SECTION 2. CHAPTER 42-28.2 OF THE GENERAL LAWS ENTITLED "POLICE
9 OFFICERS' COMMISSION ON STANDARDS AND TRAINING" IS HEREBY AMENDED BY
10 ADDING THERETO THE FOLLOWING SECTION:

11 42-28.2-8.1. Educational requirements -- Hate crimes. -- The
12 commission on standards and training shall prepare and publish manda-
13 tory training standards to provide instruction for police officers in
14 identifying, responding to and reporting all incidents of "hate
15 crimes" pursuant to section 42-28-46. The commission shall include
16 this training in all curricula for recruits and in-service trainees,
17 in all police academies operated or certified by the commission.

18 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect January 1, 1994.

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

6 The act would take effect on January 1, 1994.





It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 37-15-5 of the General Laws in Chapter 37-15
2 entitled "Litter Control and Recycling" is hereby amended to read as
3 follows:

4 37-15-5. Enforcement. -- (a) State police officers, local police
5 officers, forest rangers, park police officers, conservation officers,
6 and all other state and local enforcement officers, and department
7 staff members as designated by the director are hereby authorized to
8 enforce the provisions of this chapter.

9 (b)(1) All violations of this chapter shall be heard by the divi-
10 sion for administrative adjudication of the department of transporta-
11 tion in accordance with chapter 43 of title 31.

12 (2) Subsection (b)(1) shall not be construed to limit the juris-
13 diction of any court to hear violations of other laws, including local
14 ordinances and regulations relating to litter.

15 (c) Cities and towns may, through their chief executive officers,
16 authorize designated municipal employees in addition to those de-
17 scribed in subsection (a) to enforce the provisions of this chapter.

1 The employees may also be authorized to enforce local ordinances and
2 regulations relating to litter; and the removal and disposal of snow
3 from a sidewalk onto a public right-of-way and/or private property
4 onto a public right-of-way; or pursuant to section 31-22-9.

5 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

1 This act would permit designated local city and town offi-
2 cials to issue citations for disposal of snow on public rights-
