





It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 38-2-4 of the General Laws in Chapter 38-2 entitled "Cost" is
2 hereby amended to read as follows:

3 38-2-4. Cost. - Subject to the provisions of the general law §38-2-3 a public body
4 must allow copies to be made or provide copies of public records. The cost per copied
5 page of written public documents shall not exceed fifteen cents (\$.15) per page for
6 documents copyable on common business or legal size paper. Except that copies of
7 accident reports from city or town police departments shall cost five dollars (\$5.00) per
8 report.

9 A reasonable charge may be made for search or retrieval of documents. Hourly
10 costs for search and retrieval shall not exceed fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per hour and not
11 costs shall be charged for the first ten (10) minutes of search or retrieval.

12 Copies of documents shall be provided and search and retrieval of documents
13 accomplished within reasonable time after a request. A public body shall provide an
14 estimate of the costs of a request for documents prior to providing copies.

15 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
