ORDINANCE(S) SECOND READING

The Following Ordinance was in City Council April 8, 2021, Read and Passed the First Time and is Returned for Passage the Second Time:

COUNCIL PRESIDENT MATOS, (By Request):

An Ordinance in Amendment of Chapter 2019-84, No. 337, Approved July 9, 2019 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, making an Appropriation of Seven Hundred Seventy Million, One Hundred Sixty-Nine Thousand, Four Hundred Ninety-Four Dollars and no cents (\$770,169,494.00) for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2020, As Amended.

WHEREAS, The receipts for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021, have been estimated to amount to FIVE HUNDRED TEN MILLION, NINE HUNDRED SIXTEEN THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED SIXTY DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$510,917,760.00), made up as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE:

Section 1. To defray the expenses of the City of Providence for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2021, the sums of money or so much thereof, as are authorized by law, indicated in the accompanying schedule, are hereby appropriated for the objects and purposes, and in amounts expressed therein provided that payments there under shall be subject to the provisions of the Home Rule Charter of 1980, validated by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island at its January Session, A.D., 1981, and approved November 4, 1980, and subject to the provisions of the City Ordinances relative to the expenditures of money from the City Treasury. Fiscal Assistance to State and Local Governments rules and regulations shall govern the portion of this Budget so designated.

Section 2. The City has appropriated \$130,046,611 to the Providence School Department for the fiscal year 2021.

Section 3. Any transfer to the General Fund from Expendable Trust Funds shall be restricted to and deemed to be utilized for the reduction of debt obligations of the City of Providence, as provided for in Section 808 of the Home Rule Charter.

Section 4. The provisions included in this ordinance supersede any prior ordinances or any provisions thereof.

Section 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 17-185 and Section 17-186 of the Code of Ordinances, the amount of \$ 73,494,647 is hereby appropriated to the Pension Accumulation Fund based on a 20-year amortization of the pension liability.

Section 6. No payments can be made from the general fund to employees that were originally hired under non-local source funds without prior approval from the City Council through an Ordinance.

Section 7. The City shall make an appropriation for Rainy Day Fund of no less than \$100,000.

Section 8. All legal counsel hired by any department, board, agency or quasi city agency shall fall under the direction of the City Solicitor unless hired under Providence Home Rule Charter Section 401(d).

Section 9. Not less than Thirty-five percent (35%) of revenue generated from School Zone Speed Cameras, less contractual costs associated with School Zone Speed Cameras and up to \$75,000 of direct personnel cost associated with School Zone Speed Camera, shall be placed in a revolving fund for the purpose of citywide traffic calming and school safety initiatives. A report shall be submitted to the City Council quarterly to identify status. The funds shall be appropriated by resolution of the Providence City Council.

Section 10. No collective bargaining unit employee shall receive additional compensation in excess of the Collective Bargaining Agreement without agreement from the respective union.

Section 11. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage.

SECTION 64

The number of employees in the Office of the Mayor shall not be limited. The Mayor may appoint without reference to civil service provisions and without the necessity for approval by the City Council, a Chief of Staff and such Deputies, Assistants, Aides, Secretaries, Stenographers, Clerks and other personnel, as he may deem necessary.

SECTION 65

No person shall be appointed to, and the City Treasurer shall not pay, nor shall an officer or employee of the city issue a check for the payment of, nor pay any salary or compensations to a person holding or claiming to hold a position in the classified service in any department which is in excess of the total number of positions or the number of any individual class of positions provided herein for the particular development; provided, however, that with the approval of the department head and the Director of Finance, said maximum may be exceeded temporarily when regular employees are absent on vacation and the excess employees do not aggregate more than the number on vacation or during the absences of employees on sick leave, and it is necessary to employ temporary employees for the duration of the employee's sick leave, or during the absences of employees who have been granted a temporary leave of absence or when in the opinion of the Director of Finance, a temporary emergency exists.

SECTION 66

Where no maximum limit is fixed on the total number of positions or the number of any individual class of positions in a department, the number of persons appointed and employees shall be determined by the unexpended appropriation available.

SECTION 67

Effective with the adoption of this Ordinance, Officers and Employees of the City of Providence may authorize Employees to perform duties of a higher rated classification only when a temporary vacancy exists in the higher rated classification, cause by leave or retirement, and that said position is funded and provided for in this Ordinance. Said assignment may be for a maximum of 90 days per fiscal year with notice to the Personnel Director. Any period longer than 90 days shall be approved by the Personnel Director and such approval with reasons for the extension shall be provided to the City Council.

SECTION 68

No officer or employee shall receive any payment deemed to be a purported retroactive payment for employment prior to the current budget year, with the exception of a binding arbitration award, a court order, or equivalent order.

SECTION 69

This ordinance shall take effect upon passage.

COUNCILMAN CORREIA AND COUNCILWOMAN RYAN

An Ordinance of the City of Providence Approving Improvements to the Providence Water Supply Board's Distribution System and Appurtenances thereto, including, but not limited to the cleaning, relining, repair and replacement of water mains, transmission lines, service lines and valves, and attendant expenses and approving the financing thereof by the issuance of Water Revenue Bonds and Notes therefor in the amount not to exceed \$21,000,000.00.

SECTION 1. The sum of Twenty-One Million Dollars (\$21,000,000) is appropriated for improvements to the Providence Water Supply Board ("Providence Water") distribution system and appurtenances thereto, including but not limited to cleaning, relining, repair and replacement of water mains, transmission lines, service lines and valves (the "Project"), including funding a debt service reserve fund and costs of issuance. The period of usefulness of the improvements financed as part of the Project is expected to be not less than forty (40) years.

SECTION 2. In accordance with Chapter 46-12.8 of the Rhode Island General Laws, the City Treasurer and the Mayor are hereby authorized to borrow an amount not exceeding Twenty One Million Dollars (\$21,000,000) from the Rhode Island Infrastructure Bank, and to evidence such loan, such officers are hereby authorized to issue and refund on behalf of the City, in an amount not exceeding Twenty One Million Dollars (\$21,000,000) water revenue bonds (the "Bonds") of the City, at one time, or from time to time in order to meet the foregoing appropriation.

SECTION 3. The said officers from time to time may issue and refund not exceeding \$21,000,000 interest bearing or discounted water revenue notes (the "Notes") in anticipation of the issue of said Bonds.

SECTION 4. The Bonds and Notes shall be payable solely from revenues of the Providence water supply system. The City may issue bonds, notes, or other obligations on a parity with these Bonds. The manner of sale, amount, denominations, maturities, conversion or registration privileges, interest rates, medium of payment, and other terms, conditions and details of the Bonds or Notes may be fixed by the officers authorized to sign the Bonds or Notes. The net debt of the City is not affected by the issuance of the Bonds or Notes and the Bonds and Notes authorized hereby will be within all debt and other limitations prescribed by the Constitution and the laws of Rhode Island.

SECTION 5. Pending the issuance of the Bonds under Section 2 hereof or pending or in lieu of the issue of Notes under Section 3 hereof, the General Manager of Providence Water may expend funds from the Water Fund of the City for the purposes specified in Section 1 hereof. Any advances made under this section shall be repaid without interest from the proceeds of the Bonds or Notes issued hereunder or from the proceeds of applicable federal or state assistance or from other available funds.

SECTION 6. The City Treasurer, the Mayor and the General Manager of Providence Water are also authorized, empowered and directed, on behalf of the City, to: (i) execute, acknowledge and deliver a Supplemental Indenture (the "Supplemental Indenture") by and between the City and U. S. Bank, National Association, as trustee (the "Trustee") amending and supplementing the Trust Indenture dated June 5, 2008 by and between the City and the Trustee (as supplemented, the "Indenture") relating to the Bonds and any and all other loan agreements, documents, including disclosure documents for investors, certificates or instruments necessary to effectuate such borrowing; (ii) amend, modify or supplement the Indenture, the Bonds or Notes and any and all other loan agreements, documents, certificates or instruments at any time and from time to time, in such manner and for such purposes as such officers shall deem necessary, desirable or advisable; (iii) direct the Trustee with regard to investments of trust funds pursuant to the Trust Indenture, and (iv) do and perform all such other acts and things deemed by such officers to be necessary, desirable or advisable with respect to any matters contemplated by this Ordinance.

SECTION 7. The City Treasurer, the Mayor and the General Manager of Providence Water are hereby authorized to deliver the Bonds or Notes to the purchaser and said officers are hereby authorized and instructed to take all actions, on behalf of the City and Providence Water, necessary to ensure that interest on the Bonds or Notes will be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes and to refrain from all actions which would cause interest on the Bonds or Notes to become subject to federal income taxes.

SECTION 8. The Director of Finance, the Mayor and the General Manager of Providence Water are authorized to take all actions necessary to comply with federal tax and securities laws including Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "SEC Rule") and to execute and deliver one or more Disclosure Certificates in connection with the Bonds or Notes in the form as shall be deemed advisable by the Director of Finance, the Mayor and the General Manager of Providence Water in order to comply with the SEC Rule. The City hereby covenants and agrees that it will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of the Disclosure Certificates, as they may be amended from time to time. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance or the Bonds or Notes, failure of the City or Providence Water to comply with a Disclosure Certificates shall not be considered an event of default; however, any Bondholder or Noteholder may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking mandate or specific performance by court order, to cause the City or Providence Water to comply with its obligations under this Section and under the Disclosure Certificate.

SECTION 9. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage.

An Ordinance Supplementing Ordinance Chapter 2018-45 and Approving the Issuance of not to exceed \$100,690,000 General Obligation Bonds, Notes and other evidences of indebtedness to fund the City's School Capital Improvements Plan.

WHEREAS, The City of Providence (the "City") intends to fund the school capital improvements plan for the Fiscal Years 2019-2024 (the "Projects") and to finance the Projects through the issuance of bonds pursuant to Ordinance Chapter 2018-45 adopted by the City Council effective August 8, 2018 and approved by the voters of the City at the election of November 6, 2018 (the "2018 Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, The timing is such that the capital improvements plan originally contemplated for Fiscal Years 2019- 2024 is now being finalized and implemented and the full financing need at this time is \$100,690,000 for the projects originally included in the capital improvements plan for Fiscal Years 2019 through 2024; and

WHEREAS, The estimated cost of the Projects is \$160,000,000, however, the City expects to use up to \$59,305,654 in grants or other "financial assistance" as defined in Section 45-38.2-1(6), from the School Building Authority Capital Fund under chapter 38.2 of chapter 45 of the general laws for such Projects and accordingly, pursuant to Section 4 of the 2018 Ordinance, the amount of borrowing authorized pursuant to the 2018 Ordinance must be reduced by the amount of any grant received by the City from the School Building Authority Capital Fund; and

WHEREAS, As required by Section 4 of the 2018 Ordinance, the City has received a letter from the Rhode Island Department of Education ("RIDE") confirming that the current state School housing aid reimbursement rate under chapter 7 of title 16, as amended from time to time, or financial assistance from the School Building Authority Capital Fund, or pursuant to any other law hereafter enacted providing for funds .to municipalities for school housing purposes, is not less than seventy five percent (75%) of debt service for those expenditures which are eligible for state aid; and

WHEREAS. As required by Section 14 of the 2018 Ordinance, the City administration has submitted a spending plan for the proceeds of the Bonds to the City Council. The projects have been reviewed and approved by RIDE; and

WHEREAS, As required by Section 15 of the 2018 Ordinance, this Ordinance and its accompanying material are submitted by the City administration for review and approval; and

WHEREAS, The period of usefulness of the Projects is expected to be approximately thirty (30) years; and

WHEREAS, The net general obligation debt of the City (secured by the full faith and credit and taxing power of the City) after the issuance of the Bonds is expected to be \$149,740,510 and the Bonds will be within all debt and other limitations prescribed by the Constitution and laws of the State of Rhode Island.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Rhode Island General Laws § 45-12-2, Section 807(e) of the Providence Home Rule Charter, a vote of the City electorate on November 6, 2018 and the 2018 Ordinance, the City Treasurer and the Mayor are authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the City in an amount not to exceed \$100,690,000 (the "Bonds") in order to meet the appropriation set forth in the 2018 Ordinance.

SECTION 2. The manner of sale, forms, amount, denominations, maturities, conversion or registration privileges, interest rates, and other conditions and details of the Bonds authorized herein shall be fixed by the said officers. The City may enter into a financing and/or other agreements with the Rhode Island Health and Educational Building Corporation pursuant to Title 45, Chapter 38.1 of the General Laws.

SECTION 3. To fund the capital improvements plan originally contemplated for Fiscal Years 2019- 2024 in the 2018 Ordinance as modified and supplemented herein, the City Council hereby authorizes the City Treasurer and the Mayor, acting on behalf of the City, to issue the Bonds for the purposes set forth herein and to take all actions as they deem necessary to effect the issuance of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be issued by the City under its corporate name and seal or a facsimile of such seal. The Bonds and Notes shall be signed by the manual or facsimile signature of the City Treasurer and the Mayor.

SECTION 4. The City Treasurer and the Mayor are hereby authorized to issue the Bonds and Notes and deliver them to the purchaser and said officers are hereby authorized and instructed to take all actions, on behalf of the City, necessary to ensure that interest on the Bonds and Notes will be excludable from gross income for federal income tax purposes and to refrain from all actions which would cause interest on the Bonds and Notes to become subject to federal income taxes.

SECTION 5. The Bonds may be issued either alone or consolidated with other issues of notes or bonds of the City.

SECTION 6. The City's Finance Director is authorized to execute and deliver continuing disclosure certificates in connection with the Bonds issued by the City, in such form as shall be deemed advisable by the City's Finance Director. The City hereby covenants and agrees that it will comply with and carry out all of the provisions of each continuing disclosure certificate, as it may be amended from time to time. Notwithstanding any other provision of this ordinance or the Bonds or Notes, failure of the City to comply with any continuing disclosure certificate shall not be considered an event of default; however, any bondholder or noteholder may take such actions as may be necessary and appropriate, including seeking mandate or specific performance by court order, to cause the City to comply with its obligations under this ordinance and under any continuing disclosure certificate.

SECTION 7. The Treasurer and the Mayor are also authorized, empowered and directed, on behalf of the City, to: (i) execute, acknowledge and deliver any and all other documents, certificates or instruments necessary to effectuate such borrowing, including, without limitation, a Preliminary Official Statement, a final Official Statement, all in such form and with such provisions as such officer shall deem advisable; (ii) amend, modify or supplement the bonds or notes and any and all other documents, certificates or instruments at any time and from time to time, in such manner and for such purposes as such officers shall deem necessary, desirable or advisable; (iii) do and perform all such other acts and things deemed by such officers to be necessary, desirable or advisable with respect to any matters contemplated by this ordinance in order to effectuate said borrowing and the intent hereof.

SECTION 8. The 2018 Ordinance contained the City's declaration of official intent pursuant to Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse the City's General Fund for certain capital expenditures for the Projects paid on or after the date which is sixty (60) days prior to the date of the 2018 Ordinance, but prior to the issuance of the Bonds and the City hereby reaffirms that declaration.

SECTION 9. Expenditures of the proceeds from any bonds issued hereunder shall be reported by the Director of Public Property to the Providence City Council on at least a quarterly basis. Notwithstanding the requirements of this Section, failure to comply with this Section shall not affect the validity of any bonds issued hereunder

SECTION 10. This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval by the Mayor after its passage.
