

SUBJECT: Abandonment of a Portion of Orange Street

Gentlemen:

The portion of Orange Street from the easterly line of Dyer Street to its easterly termination serves no useful purpose other than as a means of access to the Gammino Building at 200 Dyer Street and the parking lot that has been created in the area adjacent to and under the Providence River Bridge approaches.

If this portion of the street were to be abandoned, there would be no substantial change in the access available to these properties under the present manner in which they are being used. In addition, a substantial amount of land would be made available for off-street parking purposes.

From a traffic movement standpoint, it is therefore recommended that this portion of Orange Street be abandoned.

extended to the Harbor Line.



FAUNCE DRIVE, from Cole Avenue westerly and southerly to its southerly termination; grade be defined; declare a public highway; bring to the established or defined grade at the expense of the abutting owners; curbing be set at the expense of the abutting owners.

GILBERT STREET, from Hammond Street to Brigham Street; grade be defined; declare a public highway; bring to the established or defined grade at the expense of the abutting owners; curbing be set at the expense of the abutting owners.

GRIDLEY STREET, from Ledge Street to Blomark Street; declare and establish as a public highway; bring to the established or defined grade at the expense of the abutting owners; curbing be set at the expense of the abutting owners.

HILARY DRIVE, from Smith Street southwesterly and southwesterly to the plat division line of "The John, Rao, Jr. Fiat" and "Academy Farm" and of the southwesterly 32 feet of Hilary Drive, from the above mentioned plat division line to Cathedral Avenue; grade be defined; declare a public highway; bring to the established or defined grade at the expense of the abutting owners; curbing be set at the expense of the abutting owners.

HILL CREST AVENUE, from Freedom Road to Ada Avenue; establish as a public highway; bring to the established or defined grade at the expense of the abutting owners; curbing be set at the expense of the abutting owners.

LESLIE DRIVE, from Mount Pleasant Avenue southerly, southerly and westerly to Mount Pleasant Avenue; grade be defined; declare a public highway; bring to the established or defined grade at the expense of the abutting owners; curbing be set at the expense of the abutting owners.

MAXCY DRIVE, from Faunce Drive to Wriston Drive; declare a public highway; bring to the established or defined grade at the expense of the abutting owners; curbing be set at the expense of the abutting owners.


