SUBJECT: Intersection of Fruit Hill Avenue and Manton Avenue

Gentlemen:

The Traffic Engineering Department has investigated the advisability of installing traffic signal lights at the intersection of Manton Avenue and Fruit Hill Avenue, as requested in Council Resolution 213, dated March 16, 1956.

As a result of this investigation, an examination of the quantity and type of accidents was conducted, as well as volume studies, and other information was gathered concerning the movement of traffic through this intersection. The volume of traffic using this intersection is relatively low, but there appears to be some confusion and difficulty created by the fact that motorists cut the corners at the intersection in making their turning movements from one street to the other.

In order to eliminate this difficulty and make a more orderly path of travel, it is recommended that as a first step in controlling the traffic in this intersection, paint chanelization be used on Fruit Hill Avenue with some additional signing, as well as other pavement markings to guide the motorists in making proper turning movements through the intersection. It is our considered opinion that this type of treatment will eliminate a considerable amount of the accident problem as it now exists; and therefore a traffic signal is not necessary at this intersection at this time.

SUBJECT: Cranston Street - Hoyle Square to City Line

Gentlemen:

The Traffic Engineering Department has investigated the feasibility of eliminating the all-rolling regulation on Cranston Street, northwesterly side, from Hoyle Square to the City Line on Saturdays, as requested by Council Resolution No. 214 dated March 16, 1956.

The traffic volume on Cranston Street has been counted, and other observations have been made, in order to determine the necessity for continuing this regulation on Saturdays. The volume information indicates that Saturday is the very highest volume day of the week, with the exception of Thursday and Friday, on a 24-hour volume basis. On the rush-hour volume basis (4PM to 6PM), the period during which this regulation applies, the volume is somewhat lower, but is still substantially higher than the rest of the base portion of the day; and therefore sufficiently high to warrant the continuation of this all-rolling regulation.

Gentlemen:

The Traffic Engineering Department has investigated the advisability of installing a flashing light on utility pole No. 50 near 419 Huntington Avenue, as requested in Council Resolution No. 246 dated April 6, 1956.

It is the considered opinion of this department that a more satisfactory job of advising the motoring public of the fact that there is an increased degree of curvature to the path of Huntington Avenue can be obtained by the addition of signs and paint, rather than the installation of a single flashing signal. For this reason, shop orders have been issued directing the installation of such additional marking to delineate more clearly the course of Huntington Avenue at this point.


