Approved December 13, 1974

As discussed with you telephonically, this date, I submit the enclosure being a duly certified copy of Resolution of the City Council No. 621, approved December 13, 1974.

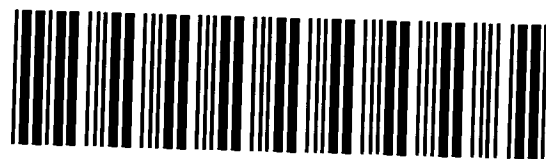
As further discussed, I will be most willing to be associated with any plan for the official dedication of the designation of this school in your late lamented father's memory.
