WHEREAS, economic development in the city is essential for the creation of jobs for city residents and the stabilization of the city's tax base;

WHEREAS, many economic development projects need federal, state and/or local assistance;

WHEREAS, the Rhode Island Overall Economic Development Program (OEDP) is a listing of projects that are eligible for federal assistance through the Economic Development Administration;

WHEREAS, it is in the city's interest to insure that projects that create short and long term jobs and help the city meet neighborhood needs are eligible for federal assistance by requesting that the projects be listed in the Rhode Island Overall Economic Development Program;




I'm writing this letter to you to continue our discussion on the property located at 278 and 276 Point Street and 15-17 Emmett Street in Providence. These three buildings have been abandoned for over two years and the one on Emmett Street has been vacant for five years.

This past winter people were living in them without running water heat or electricity. They had fires in barrels to keep warm. Last summer the smell of human waste that came from the buildings was sickening and during the Fourth of July week myself and the neighborhood Association protected the property from arson at our cost.

I am requesting that you recommend to the Providence Redevelopment Agency that the above property be demolished for safety and health reasons. As soon as possible they are a major blight on the community.

We can not go through another summer under these conditions. Your help in this matter is greatly needed.
