To the Honorable the City Council of Providence

Gentlemen:

I have the honor to report to your Honorable Body concerning a resolution requesting the Commissioner of Public Safety to establish a crossing guard post at Pocasset Avenue and Webster Avenue.

A survey was made at this location and it was determined that a crossing guard should not be placed at this location. It was the opinion of Captain George E. Healy, Director of the Traffic Bureau, that because this intersection is controlled by traffic signal control, a crossing guard could do no more than cross the children with the light.

I believe that this is a valid reason against the assignment of a crossing guard and, therefore, I do not recommend that such a post be established at this location.

To the Honorable the City Council of Providence

Gentlemen:

I have the honor to report to your Honorable Body concerning a resolution requesting the Commissioner of Public Safety to establish a crossing guard post at the intersection of Roger Williams Avenue and Alexander Street.

A survey was made recently by the Police Department at this location and, because of the small number of children crossing, it was not recommended that a crossing guard be placed at this intersection. A survey was conducted at this intersection in December, 1962 with the same result. Signs have been erected on Roger Williams Avenue, east and west of Alexander Street, indicating a school area to slow traffic.

A crossing guard is now on duty at Roger Williams Avenue and Reservoir Avenue. This intersection has traffic signal control and marked crosswalks. Captain Healy, Director of the Traffic Bureau, has recommended that if a crossing guard were to be assigned to Roger Williams Avenue and Alexander Street, the one now assigned to Roger Williams Avenue and Reservoir Avenue be moved to the requested location. If this were done, the crosswalks at Roger Williams and Reservoir Avenues should be zebra-striped, and this, together with the traffic control now in operation, would be an aid to the pedestrians crossing at that intersection.

I feel that this recommendation is worthwhile and I concur with the suggested action.
