CHAPTER 1580

No. 670 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 1565, BY TRANSFERRING THE SUM OF ONE HUNDRED FIFTEEN THOUSAND (\$115,000) DOLLARS FROM HIGHWAY SECTION, ITEM 0 AND TEN THOUSAND (\$10,000) DOLLARS FROM SEWER CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE SECTION, ITEM 0 TO AN ACCOUNT TO BE KNOWN AS "PUBLIC WORKS GENERAL ADMINISTRATION BUILDING".

Approved December 6, 1963

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1565 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, as approved September 24, 1963 entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$44,468,244.36 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1964", is hereby amended by transferring the sum of One Hundred Fifteen Thousand (\$115,000) Dollars from Highway Section, Item 0 and Ten Thousand (\$10,000) Dollars from Sewer Construction and Maintenance Section, Item 0 to an account to be known as "Public Works General Administration Building."

SECTION 2. The City Controller and the City Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to transfer the sum of One Hundred Twenty Five Thousand (\$125,000) Dollars from the General Fund to an account in the Capital Funds to be known as "Public Works General Administration Building". Any unexpended balance remaining in this account upon completion of this work shall revert to the General Fund.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.



CHAPTER 1581

No. 671 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 1565, BY APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF THREE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED FORTY EIGHT AND 43/100 (\$3,948.43) DOLLARS TO THE ACCOUNT KNOWN AS "MARY ELIZABETH SHARPE TREE FUND".

Approved December 6, 1963

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1565 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence as approved September 24, 1963, entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$44,468,244.36 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1964", as amended, is hereby further amended by appropriating the sum of Three Thousand Nine Hundred Forty Eight and 43/100 (\$3,948.43) Dollars to the account known as "MARY ELIZABETH SHARPE TREE FUND".

SECTION 2. The said sum of Three Thousand Nine Hundred Forty Eight and 43/100 (\$3,948.43) Dollars as thus added and appropriated shall be obtained by authorizing and directing the City Controller and City Treasurer to transfer a like amount from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account to the Receipt Account.

SECTION 3. The estimated receipts from Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures are hereby increased by Three Thousand Nine Hundred Forty Eight and 43/100 (\$3,948.43) Dollars.

SECTION 4: The City Controller and the City Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to transfer this appropriation from the General Fund to an account in the Trust and Special Funds known as "MARY ELIZABETH SHARPE TREE FUND".

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.



WHEREAS, it has become apparent that emergency medical and clinical attention is needed within the Hartford Park Housing Development, more particularly for the benefit of the senior citizens in residency, who, because of their lack of private transportation and their limited income and limited ability to get about, it has been frequently necessary for them to seek emergency medical assistance from the Providence Fire Department Rescue Squads and other emergency means,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That The Housing Authority of The City of Providence, Rhode Island is requested to investigate and to study the apparent necessity of establishing and operating an emergency dispensary and clinic or other appropriate, on site, medical facility at the senior citizens building of said housing development located at 10 Whelan Road, said dispensary, clinic or medical facility to be for the particular benefit of senior citizen residents and, to the extent, if possible, for the general use and welfare of the remainder of the residents at the Hartford Park Housing Development and that the facility be staffed and operated by at least one registered nurse on a twenty-four hour basis.

WHEREAS, such smoking does aggravate diseases of the lungs and the circulatory system, and may predispose persons to such diseases, and

WHEREAS, all advertising media be they newspapers, magazines, radio, television and bill boards constantly urge people to smoke cigarettes without giving warning of the possible dangers therefrom, which media are all available to children of all ages.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That The School Committee be and they hereby are requested to cause to be instituted in all schools of the City a continuing and intensive educational program of the effect of cigarette smoking upon the human body and the possible serious danger therefrom.
