Whereas, The acquisition, rehabilitation, improvement and equipping of certain real estate and improvements thereon known as the John Street School (the "John Street School Project") will help to reduce overcrowding in the Providence Schools; and

Whereas, The City intends to issue Tax Increment Bonds pursuant to Chapter 33.2 of Title 45 of the General Laws to finance the John Street School Project; and

Whereas, The City expects to advance moneys from its general fund for the John Street School Project until such time as a Tax Increment Financing can be completed;

Now, therefore, be it Resolved, That the City hereby declares its official intent pursuant to Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 to reimburse the General Fund for capital expenditures made by the City in connection with the John Street School Project, in an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000, the principal amount of Bonds and/or Notes expected to be issued for the Project, provided, however, that such amounts to be reimbursed shall be reimbursed not later than eighteen months after (a) the date on which the expenditure was paid or, (b) the date the Project is placed in service or abandoned but no later than three (3) years after the date of the expenditure is paid.

Whereas, On June 18, 1993, the Providence City Council, by and through Resolution 427, memorialized their intention to convey certain foreclosed properties from the City of Providence to the Providence Redevelopment Agency; and

Whereas, It is still the intention of the Providence City Council to convey property located at 677 Cranston Street, on Assessor's Plat 42, Lot 277 to the Providence Redevelopment Agency in that it is no longer useful for municipal purposes and it has been found to be in the best interest of the City of Providence and its respective neighborhoods;

Now, therefore, be it Resolved, That it remains and always was the intention of the City of Providence that deed not be executed transferring said properties listed in Resolution 427, Approved June 18, 1993, until, a project or a property owner had been identified by the Providence Redevelopment Agency.

Be it further Resolved, That the Providence Redevelopment Agency shall see that said property is developed in accordance with the City's comprehensive Plan and Zoning Ordinance; and that all proceeds from the sale of this property, minus any administrative, manage-

ment, insurance or development costs shall be returned to the City of Providence.

And also, be it further Resolved, That a use has been identified for property located at 677 Cranston Street, Plat 42, Lot 277, and that His Honor, the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute any and all documents, including the deed, relative to the conveyance of said parcel.

Resolution in support of the Urban Collaborative
Financing of the building located at 130
Broadway.

Whereas, The Providence City Council seeks to assist the Providence School Department in its efforts to provide Providence students with a valuable education at a reasonable cost to taxpayers; and

Whereas, The Chamber of Commerce Academy and the Urban Collaborative are innovative schools for Providence students who sometimes experience difficulty in traditional settings; and

Whereas, Both of these schools are in need of facilities to house their programs on a permanent basis; and

Whereas, The Providence School Department can work closely with the Urban Collaborative to provide such space at a reasonable cost to taxpayers; and

Whereas, This support will take the form of a lease and sub-lease between the Providence School Department and the Urban Collaborative, with such lease being used as a security for a traditional bank loan; and

Whereas, The Providence School Department will assure financial responsibility for the payment of debt relating to financing in the event of dissolution of the Urban Collaborative; and

Whereas, The Providence School Department will have access to all Capital Campaign funds, property, revenue, and other assets of the Urban Collaborative upon its dissolution in a situation of debt; and

Whereas, The Urban Collaborative will make all efforts to provide the Chamber of Commerce Academy with acceptable quarters in a timely cost and effective manner; and

Whereas, Now, be it Resolved, That the Providence City Council gives its approval for the Providence School Board to enter into a lease and sub-lease arrangement with the Urban Collaborative, recognizing the responsibilities of the Providence School Department in the event of dissolution of the Urban Collaborative, so that the Urban Collaborative may obtain financing for the acquisition and renovation of 130 Broadway and provide quarters for the Chamber of Commerce Academy.

This arrangement will have the following conditions and terms.

1.) The lease payment to the Urban Collaborative will be equal to the annual debt of service payment to Citizens Bank.

2.) The sublease payment to the Providence School Department will be equal to the lease payment made by the School Department as reduced by any additional State Aid received by the School Department due to this financing arrangement.

3.) The Chamber of Commerce School lease shall be approximately \$4.60 per square foot.

4.) The Urban Collaborative will give special consideration to Providence residents and minority applicants for teaching positions.

5.) The city shall have security interest in the building and all assets of the Urban Collaborative in the event of the dissolution of the Urban Collaborative or default on the loan.

Further. The Providence City Council requests the Providence School Board to direct the Superintendent to take necessary actions for the acquisition and renovation of 130 Broadway, for the Urban Collaborative, and the location of the Chamber of Commerce Academy at this site.
