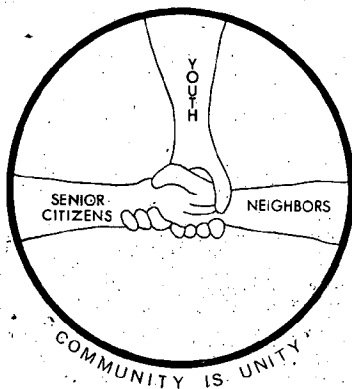

Please be advised that the Washington Park Citizens' Association Executive Board, voted unanimously to have you act on behalf of this association to:

- 1) Allow the Association to be involved in the planning and the restoration of Columbia Park, under the "funding allotted from the Mayor's Office of Community Development" of \$53,000.

We want to have some input into this project.

It was further resolved that this park should be maintained by the Department of Public Properties, every two weeks, (bi-weekly) This park has been neglected in the past.

- 2) Whereas the residents of the Columbia Park area has requested that "No Parking Anytime Standards" be installed along the lower half of Vermont Avenue, between Michigan Avenue and Narragansett Blvd. This street is now one way from Easterly on Michigan Avenue to Westerly at Narragansett Blvd.

The reason for this request is that residents of the northerly side of Washington Avenue whose detached garages are facing Vermont Ave. are having difficulty getting in and out of their driveways on Vermont Avenue.

The students from the Johnson & Wales Culinary School park along the aforementioned street during the daytime and the people using the park during the evening park there obstructing their driveways and the street.

This parking problem also creates a problem for emergency vehicles if they need use of this street, being a narrow street.
