I would like to ask your help in changing the name of a street which is in the Third Ward of Providence.

It is the very short street running between South Main Street and Canal Street, currently called Lonsdale Street. There are no buildings entering on this street at this time. The law firm of which I am a member is planning to lease office space in the building which houses the Fain Carpet Store on South Main Street, and a new entrance to that building will be made on Lonsdale Street.

We would like to change the name of that street to Park Row because we believe that it will enhance the entire area. As you know, the street borders on the large tract of U.S. Government park land adjacent to the Roger Williams Spring Park.


