





Gentlemen:

We have completed our investigation of your resolution concerning the need for a two hour parking time limit on both sides of Manton Ave. between Chalkstone Avenue and Herschel Street. The results of our parking studies made as a part of this investigation do not indicate that there is a long term parking problem in this area. In addition, there are several off-street parking lots which are conveniently located with respect to the businesses in this area. Accordingly, we feel that the availability of parking as it now stands presents a proper balance for the existing demands and we do not recommend the establishment of a two hour time limit at this time.





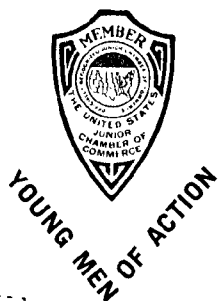
