IN AMENDMENT OF SECTION 9 OF CHAPTER 2514 OF THE 1950, PUBLIC LAWS,  
ENTITLED "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR OFF-STREET PARKING FACILITIES IN  
PROVIDENCE."

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 9 of Chapter 2514 of the 1950 Public  
Laws, entitled "An Act Providing for Off-Street Parking Facilities  
in Providence" is hereby amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 9. In each instance wherein the city council  
shall have before it for consideration a proposal  
to expend money for the purpose of establishing  
off-street parking facilities there shall be filed  
with the city council, signed by the mayor and the  
traffic engineer, a report of said proposed project  
with estimates of the cost, including the cost of  
any necessary property acquisition; an estimate  
of the income yield of the facility; a statement  
showing that the proposed facilities conform to  
the general plan developed under section 4; and such  
other pertinent information as will permit the city  
council to decide the necessity, extent, cost and in-  
come yield of the proposed facility."

SEC. 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT

EXCEPTING CERTAIN SPECIAL ELECTIONS IN THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE FROM THE ELECTION LAWS OF THE STATE IN CERTAIN RESPECTS.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Any special election hereinafter held in the City of Providence for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said City the questions of the approval of the issuance of bonds for any purpose whatsoever, or such other questions relating to the City as the Council shall by ordinance deem appropriate, shall be held in conformity with the Election Laws of this state, excepting that:

(a) The warrant providing for said referendum shall be issued at least 10 days before the date fixed for said referendum and need not be posted as otherwise provided by law, but the same shall be posted by publication in a daily newspaper having local circulation.

(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, paper ballots may be used in lieu of voting machines.

(c) The number of polling places to be provided for shall be not less than 3 nor more than 6 for each ward.

(d) The number of officials for each polling place shall be not less than 4 nor more than 8.

(e) The voting hours shall be from 10:00 A.M. to 9:00 P.M.

(f) One check list of voters shall be used at each voting place in lieu of the customary two check lists.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage, and all acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
