Dear Mr. Bergemann:

In Re: Improving street lighting along Fillmore Street.

I recently received Resolution #150, approved on March 17, 1975, by the City Council for a survey of the existing street lighting along Fillmore Street, for the purpose of improving the same.

This, I am sure, was prompted by the recent newspaper articles, radio and television coverage, regarding the vandalism, at its utmost, within the Chad Brown Housing Project. Upon field inspection I found practically all the windows, in the Project, boarded up and all the walkway lighting totally destroyed.

Therefore, pursuing the same theme, we discussed on the telephone relative to this matter, I would recommend the following.

INSTALL

Fillmore Street

Poles #8-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ -11 $\frac{1}{2}$

3-7000 Lumen Mercury Vapor

Poles will have to be set for the new 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ & 11 $\frac{1}{2}$, to close up the long spacing, and then should give good illumination at approximately 130' spacing.
