



WORK EXPERIENCE:

Nov. 1979 to Present	Blackstone Valley District Commission, State of Rhode Island, Managing Engineer/Executive Secretary responsible for Administration and operations of a large wastewater treatment facility under the administrative direction of a commission. The facility serves 160,000 people within the cities of Pawtucket, Central Falls, East Providence (portion), and towns of Cumberland, Lincoln and Smithfield (portion). Facility employs 60 Administrative and Operational Personnel and has a budget of \$4,000,000 per year.
Dec. 1976 to Nov. 1979	City of Providence, Providence Water Supply Board, Chief Engineer. Responsible for 150 people in a large water system serving 460,000 people with a budget of \$6,000,000 per year.
Dec. 1972 to Dec. 1976	City of Woonsocket, Director of Public Works. Responsible for 140 people within the divisions of water, sewer, highway, solid waste, parks, recreation, engineering and city property.

Nov. 1966 to Nov. 1969	City of Providence, Providence Water Supply Board, Principal Engineer. Resident engineer in charge of \$18,000,000 water supply project in which new filters, pumping station and 10 miles of large tunnels and aquaducts were constructed.
Mar. 1964 to Nov. 1966	City of Providence Public Works Department, Division Engineer and Deputy Director of Public Works. As Division Engineer was responsible for 450 people involved in construction and maintenance of highways, sewers and bridges. As Deputy Director assumed responsibilities in overall administration of 700-800 people.
Apr. 1962 to Mar. 1964	Alumline Corp. Plant Manager. Responsible for all plant operations and engineering for the anodizing and fabrication of architectural products for buildings, 200 people employed.

Assisted president in managing plant employing 100 people for the manufacture and maintenance of optical and surveying instruments.

Mar. 1947 to Mar. 1960 Grinnell Corp., Assistant to Plant Manager, Plant Superintendent, General Foreman and Assignment Engineer.
Started work for Grinnell Corp. as an Assignment Engineer relocating and increasing efficiencies of various manufacturing operations for fire protection devices to another location and later became General Foreman and finally Plant Superintendent in charge of plant at the new location. As Plant Superintendent was responsible for engineering, personnel, manufacturing, labor relations, foundry operations for plant employing 175 people. Later was promoted to Assistant to Plant Manager of parent plant to help in the administration of plant employing 1,200 people.

Prepared engineering studies and specifications for the manufacture of tennis and rubber footwear.

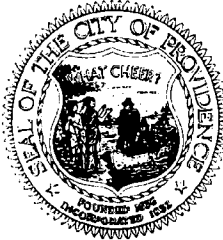
