

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 590

Approved September 15, 2000

WHEREAS, An Ordinance appropriating \$50 million and authorizing the issuance of \$50 million in bonds for the Neighborhood Improvement Program: A Plan to Revitalize Providence's Neighborhood's was adopted (1997-27); and;

WHEREAS, said ordinance requires that "each component of said plan will be developed and approved by the City Council prior to the expenditures of any funds", and;

WHEREAS, \$29,419,959.80 million has been appropriated by Council Resolution No. 375 dated June 30, 1997 as well as Council resolution Numbers 474 dated August 22, 1997, 610 dated October 19, 1997, 702 & 703 dated December 19, 1997, 163 dated March 16, 1998, 258 & 259 dated April 24, 1998, 357 dated June 26, 1998, 555 dated September 28, 1998, 719 dated December 28, 1998, 118 dated February 28, 1999, 276 dated May 14, 1999, 486 dated August 16, 1999 and No. 705 dated November 15, 1999 for various projects; and ;

WHEREAS, plans have been developed for additional components of the Neighborhood Improvement Program;

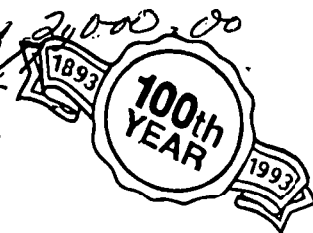

4. **Job #1: Otha Boone parking lot:**

Remove and dispose debris, asphalt, grass and unsuitable material on lot totaling 1,476 sq. yds. approx., lot abuts Haskin Street and Wickham Street.

Furnish and install 4" to 6" of processed blend on entire lot to establish a stable base.

Fine grade and vibratory roll base totaling 1,476 sq. yds.

Furnish and install 1 1/2" compacted thickness of hot mix bituminous concrete binder course on 1,476 sq. yds.

Furnish and install 1 1/2" compacted thickness of hot mix bituminous concrete surface course on 1,266 sq. yds.

This work will be done for the sum of-----\$12,800.00

Job #2: D.A.R.E. parking lot:

Remove and dispose existing asphalt totaling 691 sq. yds. approx. around north and west side of building at rear of Burger King.

Fine grade and vibratory compact gravel base.

Furnish and install 1 1/2" compacted thickness of hot mix bituminous concrete binder course on 691 sq. yds.

Furnish and install 1 1/2" compacted thickness of hot mix bituminous concrete surface course on 691 sq. yds.

This work will be done for the sum of-----\$9,600.00

Note: If both jobs can be done at same time, deduct- \$1,400.00 from total.

Note: Sales taxes on materials are not included unless otherwise specified. All payments more than 30 days in arrears shall be accessed a service charge of 1 1/2% per month on the unpaid balance. If payment is not made as stated and Narragansett Improvement deems it necessary to refer the matter for collection to an attorney, it is agreed that all costs of collection, including a reasonable attorney's fee shall be added to the unpaid balance.
