SECTION 1. Chapter 21 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended by adding Section 21-16 which shall read as follows:

"Section 21-16. Board of Tax Assessment Review to Hear Appeals on Excise Tax.

The Board of Tax Assessment Review shall have the power to hear, review and act upon appeals of the assessment of vehicles for purposes of determining excise tax in the same manner as it acts upon Real Estate Assessments."

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its Passage.



Dear Honorable Members:

I hereby disapprove and veto the Ordinance in Amendment of Chapter 21 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence by adding Section 21-16 to be entitled "Board of Tax Assessment Review" to hear appeals on Excise Taxes.

I have taken this action reluctantly because in enacting the new tax laws on automobiles the General Assembly has specifically identified this law as an excise tax. An excise tax is not the type of tax enumerated in Section 6.12 of the Charter of the City of Providence which provides for tax appeals. Additionally, the 1981-1982 FY Budget as approved by your honorable body has anticipated excise tax revenue and has made no provision for abatements.
