Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$5,000,000 to be designated as "Redevelopment and Slum Clearance Bonds IV" and to be used to effectuate any or all of the purposes or provisions of the Redevelopment Act of 1956.

Bonds in the aggregate principal of \$500,000 to be designated as "Highway Loan 1964" and to be used for the purpose of constructing and repairing such highways in the City of Providence as the City Council may determine, including the acquisition of land in said City of Providence for highway purposes.

Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,000,000 to be designated as "Classical High School Bonds" and to be used for the purpose of constructing the new Classical High School, including the acquisition of land for the use of Classical High School.

Total aggregate principal amount of bonds upon which bids were solicited and received as above specified is \$6,500,000.

the following named person, firm or corporation is hereby granted permission to erect, alter or use a building or structure at the location named herein for the sale of petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil and their products, compounds and components as described and shown in and on the application therefor and accompanying plat, all on file in the office of the Department of Building Inspection subject to the conditions that said person, firm or corporation shall not violate any of the laws of the State of Rhode Island or any of the Ordinances of the City of Providence relative to the erection, use or occupation of said structure and that said person, firm or corporation shall not allow petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil or their products, compounds or components, to be conveyed over or across any sidewalk by means of any pipe or hose, and upon such special conditions as are hereby enumerated and further provided that the Director of the Department of Building Inspection may authorize minor changes in the structural detail of plans on file, viz:

CHARLES POTTER, 1304 Eddy Street, Lot 1, Plat 87; replace three (3) filling pumps and install three (3) dual filling pumps, making a total of six (6) filling pumps on the premises.

The erection or location of any buildings or structures not shown on the original plat on file with the Director of Department of Building Inspection, or any change in the location of buildings or structures from that shown on said plat shall be deemed a violation of this permit.

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Walter P. Reuther, late President of the 1,600,000 Member United Automobile Workers, met an untimely death, at the age of sixty two, in an airplane crash near Pellston, Michigan, following a most distinguished and progressive career as head of his craft, which started as an apprentice tool and die maker at fifteen years of age, and ended after twenty four years, as President of the U. A. W., and

WHEREAS, his dynamic leadership led the historic merger of the Congress of Industrial Organization and the American Federation of Labor, a leadership that never allowed him to turn his back on the little man, the poor, the black and the young, while it permitted him to remain true to the principles of the labor movement and of the Civil Rights movement in which he emerged as a leader,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT in noting the death of Walter P. Reuther, His Honor Mayor Joseph A. Doorley, Jr. and the Members of the City Council join to express their sympathy to his survivors in the loss of one of the pioneers of that great Union of Automobile Workers and by the adoption of this Resolution do hereby signify their respect for the principles he espoused during his lifetime.
