



### **Re: Subpoena Request for Body Camera Footage in Sgt. Hanley Investigation**

Dear Honorable City Council President and members of the City Council:

On June 1, 2020, the PERA board invoked Chapter 18 ½ - 2 §(h)(2) of the Providence Code of Ordinances for the first time. This specific subsection of the PERA ordinance states that PERA “shall also have the discretion to monitor any internal investigation by the police department as to which the executive director believes it is in the city’s best interest for PERA to be involved.”

PERA officially began that independent review shortly after June 1, 2020 via its sole investigator, Mr. Eugene Monteiro.

Mr. Monteiro presented the findings of that review in the executive session of the monthly PERA board meeting on June 17, 2020 and discussed the same on our most recent board meeting on July 8, 2020. As a result of Mr. Monteiro’s findings, the PERA board has very serious concerns and has reached out to the Commissioner of Public Safety to request a further briefing for the PERA board regarding the allegations against Sergeant Joseph Hanley.

Unfortunately, PERA has been denied this request for a briefing by the Commissioner.

*As such, PERA is hereby respectfully requesting the members of the City Council issue a subpoena for all body camera footage, and related evidence, available in the investigation of Sergeant Joseph Hanley.*

It is imperative, now more than ever, that the Providence community be engaged in this meaningful conversation about policing and reform in Providence.

PERA thanks the members of the City Council in advance for their support and attention to this very important matter.
