Dear Council Members:

We hereby request permission to place a trash compactor in Wirt Street to replace the four trash containers currently being used by the Custom House Tavern, Pot au Feu and the Wilcox Building.


The compactor to be installed is 80.5 inches wide, 91 inches long and 66 inches high. It is relatively light and could be moved if necessary. The enclosed sketch will show the approximate location of the compactor.

The alley is currently unused because of the difficulty in negotiating the corners at either end. The compactor will leave ample room for pedestrian traffic, fire hoses or ladders should an emergency arise.

Aesthetically the compactor has many advantages over the dumpsters now being used. It will take up less space, it is self-contained and most importantly it is water tight which will prevent liquids from fouling the alley. The compactor will also be locked to prevent unauthorized use and to prevent accidents.


Dear Council Members:
