Gentlemen:

The City Plan Commission, at its October 21, 1987 regular monthly meeting, reviewed and evaluated the subject referral from your Committee on the proposed abandonment of Farmer Street between Sunbury Street and Douglas Avenue.

The petitioner is Mr. Paul F. DiNobile, Jr., represented by his attorney Mr. Kenneth Kando of 454 Broadway, Providence, Rhode Island. The petitioner owns two abutting parcels of land described as Assessor's lots 141 and 114 on A.P. 123.

A field inspection revealed that the subject street is a paper street which was never developed. There are curb cuts on both terminals: one on Sunbury Street and one on Douglas Avenue.

The owner of lots 115 and 116 uses the northwestern portion of Farmer Street as a driveway for his one-family house located on 145 Sunbury Street. The rest of the subject street area together with the areas of lots 141 and 114 were recently cleared from brush and bulldozed which is an obvious land preparation for a new construction.

The other abutting lot 139 is used as off-street parking and lot 138 contains a new 2 story duplex under construction. There is a significant difference in elevations between Sunbury Street and Douglas Avenue, but not to the degree which would prohibit reopening Farmer Street as a public right-of-way.

Dear Councilman Analdo:

I have recently been informed that the new owners of Lot 114, plat 123 plan to close Farmer Street. Farmer Street is only a paper street, but that does not mean that it is not used and appreciated by area residents.

For example, Pat Montonaro who is in her sixties, uses the street daily to get to Douglas Avenue so she can take the bus to work. She has been using Farmer Street for over 35 years. We also use the street to get to Douglas so we can get the bus. Other neighbors use it to get to the mail box at the corner of Douglas and River or to go to DePetrillo's Pizza. You can buy milk and bread there, it's very convenient.

If Farmer Street were to be closed to the public, we would have to walk all the way to River Street in order to get to Douglas. There is no other public access to Douglas from Sunbury, except to go all the way down to Veasie Street and through to Douglas.



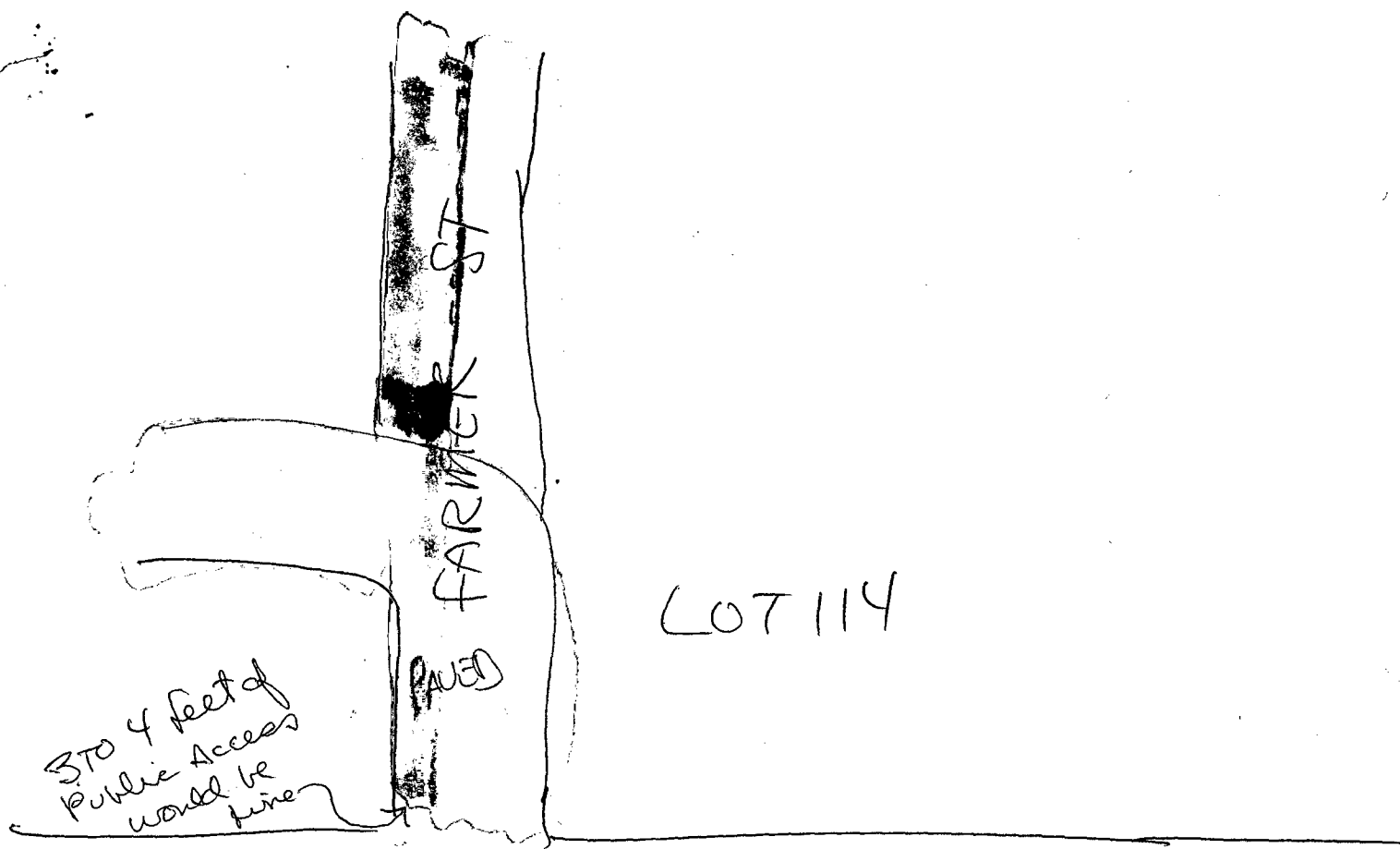


