Our football team has been entered into the Interstate Senior Football League for the past two years. The league consist of 12 teams from R. I. and Mass. To compare our program with other teams such as Central Falls, Edgewood, Pawtucket, Cranston Electric, etc, would be unfair. They are all well established and have community backed programs, while we are just cracking the surface.

Our football team pratice in the west elmwood area at Bucklin Park. Our home games are played at City Stadium. This past season our team gave the community both joy and proudness by becoming the runner ups in only their second year in the league. They had a fine record losing only to the league

Champs: These boys have shown good character and sportsmanship on and off the field. We attribute this to the fine job done by our coaches.

After our season ending Banquet we had a financial balance of \$54.15 in our account. Our account is kept in the South Providence Credit Union. We have two out standing debts and they are an equipment bill of \$418.53 and a jacket bill balance of \$384.52.
