Gentlemen:

This department has conducted a series of observations on Weybosset Street between Empire Street and Cathedral Square to determine what changes would be advisable in order to improve traffic conditions generally, and to improve the capacity of the Weybosset-Chestnut-Empire-Broad intersection.

The volume of traffic using Weybosset Street between Empire and Winslow Streets is extremely unbalanced, with five times as many vehicles approaching Empire Street as going the other way. The capacity of the signal at Empire Street is also limited by the fact that the vehicles approaching the intersection on Weybosset Street are restricted to virtually one lane.

In view of these conditions, it is recommended that City Council approve the establishment of Weybosset Street as a one-way street in an easterly direction from Winslow Street to Empire Street. It is recommended that Weybosset Street remain a two-way street from Winslow Street to Cathedral Square, due to the substantial number of vehicles entering Weybosset Street from Winslow Street.






