Be it Ordained by the City of Providence:

1. That Chapter 1977-5 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved February 14, 1977 and entitled, "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for Downtown Providence Renewal" as amended by Chapters 1978-44, 1981-26, 1981-50, 1983-7 and 1983-14 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved November 24, 1978, May 21, 1981, October 23, 1981, February 18, 1983 and April 22, 1983 respectfully, be and the same is hereby further amended as follows:

A. In paragraph 6 entitled "Duration and Effective Date of Regulations and Controls" of Section G entitled "Other Provisions Necessary to Meet Local Objectives" on Pages 22 and 23 of the Official Redevelopment Plan which is part of

the aforementioned Ordinance, add the following paragraph after the last paragraph.

"After the date of approval of this Redevelopment Plan each and all plan amendments of this Redevelopment Plan relative to all conditions, restrictions and covenants running with the land shall be in full force and effect for a period of forty (40) years commencing on the date of each of its adoption by the City Council".

PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

COUNCILMAN CLARKIN requests the floor to speak on a point of personal privilege and states:

"One Hundred Lifeguards. One Hundred lifeguards to man stations along the new River

Place and the Providence River. I've been told by some of you that you think this is crazy. That this is stupid. That this would be a complete waste of money. Well, I agree. It is stupid and it would be crazy and it certainly would be a waste of money to hire lifeguards on the premise that

maybe someday, someone would fall in the river. But, is it any more stupid, is it anymore crazy to have 100 more Firefighters than we need? The Gage Babcock Report, a Comprehensive Report on the Fire Department, completed in 1973 and updated in 1987 stated that we should close stations. That we should reduce our Fire Department from 23 Companies to 17 Companies and that report was when we had 576 Fires per year, not the 352 fires that we had last year.

Let me tell you about a magic number. This is a number that transposed us into a big City. We now rate up there with New York, Boston and Philadelphia. The number is 501. By reaching this number, we have become a big City. At least as far as the International Association of Firefighters is concerned. Remember this number because it causes us to waste \$5,000,000.00 each and every year. 501 is the amount of Firefighters a City has to have on its Fire Department in order that the International Association of Firefighters will consider it as a big City. By reaching this number, the Union Leaders on our Fire Department get extra votes at the International. They get extra votes and we get to waste \$5,000,000.00.

Minimum Manning was contrived for only one reason. It was needed by these Union Leaders on our Fire Department so they could force our Department over the 501 level of manpower. It is needed by these Union Leaders to further their political ambitions at the International Union. Let me tell you what it takes to raise the \$5,000,000.00 needed to support these unneeded Firefighters. It takes the combined real estate taxes of 11 of the top 20 taxpayers in this City. Textron, Gilbane, AT&T, Providence Washington Insurance Co., Citizens Savings Bank, Amica, The Marriot, Texaco, Algonquin LNG, Old Stone Bank and the Regency. The combined real estate taxes of these are wasted, just so our Fire Department Union Leaders can hang with the big guys in Washington.

Pat Nolan, your neighbors in Elmwood send to the City \$3,500,000.00. Every dollar is wasted.

John Rollins, you have the Sewage Treatment Plant in your area. Your friends in Washington Park might just as well flush that straight to the Plant for all the good their money does this City.

Joan, your neighbors in Olneyville need to send almost two years in taxes to support these unneeded firefighters. Every dollar is wasted just so these Union Bosses can have extra votes at the International.

John Lombardi, after the \$5,000,000.00 is taken out from your friends in Federal Hill, we have about \$200,000 left over to sweep the Streets or to buy books for the schools.

Rhode Island Hospital is estimated to be worth \$155,000,000.00. If we taxed it at the full rate of \$28.17 per \$1,000 of value, we would not get enough taxes to pay these unneeded firefighters.

Warwick, Cranston and Pawtucket have a total population of around 230,000 with a land area of 72 square miles. They have less firefighters than we do and our population is 160,000 with only 18 square miles. They have four times the area to protect and they have less men.

All over this Country, due to changes in Fire Codes, the Fire Resistant Materials that are used today, the Smoke and Heat Detectors available and the Sprinkler Systems in use, other cities have cut back on their Fire Departments.

We are the incubator for the Unions and we are the test tube. We are the Laboratory to show the other Fire Unions across this Country what can be accomplished with lies, threats and bullying tactics. Our Fire Department Union Leaders want to use this City as a showcase on how to intimidate a City into giving into outrageous demands. Minimum Manning was never a Fire Safety issue, it is only to give our Union Officials more power at the International. Thank you Mr. President".

(3) The petitioner shall convey an easement acceptable to the Providence Water Supply Board and the Department of Communications for the City of Providence, which will permit retention of their facilities in their existing location, together with the right to inspect, maintain, operate and replace the same and with

twenty-four hour access to said facilities, or in the alternative should it be determined by the petitioner that any such facilities need be relocated in order to comply with an intended use, the petitioner shall assume all costs of relocation. (4) The petitioner shall convey an easement acceptable to the Narragansett Electric Company which will permit retention of its facilities in their existing location, together with the right to inspect, maintain, operate and replace the same and with twenty-four hour access to said facilities, or in the alternative should it be determined by the petitioner that any such facilities need be relocated in order to comply with an intended use, the petitioner shall assume all costs of relocation.
