RESOLVED, That the following Minute on the life and character of the late Salvatore Mancini, Mayor of North Providence from January, 1974 to April 16, 1994 is hereby adopted, ordered, inscribed on the records of this City Council and a duly certified copy be transmitted to the family of the deceased.

MINUTE

Mayor Salvatore Mancini was born on July 31, 1919, the son of the late Vincenzo and Josephine (Maggiacomo) Mancini.

Having received his formal education in the Cranston School System, and served his country in the United States Army and Honorably Discharged.

He was first elected to public office in 1964 when he was the owner of a hardware and electric store and defeated an incumbent Democrat on the Town Council.

Mayor Mancini developed his store into a thriving business and a place for friends and neighbors to socialize and congregate.

After serving for ten extraordinary years as a member and President of the Town Council, he was elected Mayor in 1973 when the post was established by Charter.

Mayor Mancini's vocal and tenacious work for the Town of North Providence earn him the State's longest reigning Municipal Chief and endure public criticism on behalf of the citizens of North Providence. These accomplishments have been recorded in newspaper headlines and film clips over a quarter-century.

Mayor Mancini would take great pride in his more menial and less public tasks as the Chief Executive, because for him the business of politics was the business of people. He truly enjoyed being able to answer a request, settle a dispute, or solve a problem. Newspapers do not reflect these accomplishments and they are too numerous to be recorded here, but they are written in the hearts of a grateful constituency.

Mayor Mancini has numerous accomplishments, but the one that stands out most noticeably is when he built the Salvatore Mancini Union Free Library and Cultural Center (Library/Swimming Complex) and established the North Providence Senior Center which has been nationally recognized along with a number of other accomplishments.

Mayor Mancini has numerous political, governmental, community, dedication awards, recognition's and appreciations to be recorded. With his passing, Mayor Salvatore Mancini will be missed and mourned by his legion of friends and associates to whom he has bequeathed a wealth of fond and wonderful memories and may God, in his wisdom, bestow upon Mayor Mancini, eternal rest and to his family, peace and tranquillity.
