AN ORDINANCE

In Amendment of Section 17-95 of
the Code of Ordinances Relative to Application to
Persons on Military Training

Approved July 9, 2004

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Section 17-95 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby
amended as follows:

Sec. 17-95. Application to persons on military training.

Officers and ~~permanent~~ full-time employees who have been continuously
employed for at least six (6) months and who by reason of membership in
the active reserve forces of the United States or as members of the Rhode
Island National Guard are ordered by the appropriate authority to full-time
active duty and to attend full-time training activities shall be entitled to
leaves of absence with pay during the actual duration of such activity but not
to exceed fifteen (15) days in any one year. Notwithstanding, after the
completion of the aforementioned fifteen (15) days of paid military duty
leave, and for as long as the employee is required by the appropriate
authority to remain on full-time military duty leave, the City shall pay to the
employee on a weekly basis an amount equivalent to the actual difference
between the employee's then-current regular City salary (including, if
applicable, all longevity pay benefits; and including any applicable salary
increases that may take effect during the employee's military duty leave) and
the amount of pay received by the employee for his/her military service, if

This provision shall be applied retroactively to all officers and permanent employees who have served in the active reserve forces of the United States or as members of the Rhode Island National Guard ordered by the appropriate authority to full-time active duty on and after January 1, 2002.
