RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 75

Approved February 14, 1977

WHEREAS, the State of Rhode Island received approximately \$211,757.70 in sales tax revenue from the sale of Providence Water Supply Board taxable accounts exclusive of wholesale accounts namely the City of Warwick; City of East Providence; Kent County Water Authority; East Smithfield; Town of Smithfield and Town of Greenville, and

WHEREAS, the consumption for domestic purposes during the last fiscal year July 1, 1975 to June 30, 1976, of pure water is a most necessary life requirement and should not be an additional tax burden for residential owners and for users, and

WHEREAS, the amount of taxes accruing to the State of Rhode Island from said use is an amount that the State apparently can live without,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council hereby endorses the provisions of Senate Act S-190, which would exempt from sale tax water used for residential purposes.
