RESOLVED, DECREED AND ORDERED

That the following named street shown as cross-hatched area on the accompanying plan entitled, "Providence, Rhode Island, Department of Public Works - Engineering Office, Street Line Section Plan No. 064363, dated November 13, 1986",

VIZ:

Mississippi Avenue, shown as cross-hatched area on the accompanying plan and designated by the letters (A-B-C-D-A), having ceased to be useful to the public and the same is proposed to be abandoned as a Public Highway, provided that an easement shall be granted to the Providence Gas Company for their existing gas mains to operate, maintain, and replace when required, and the damage to the abutters is appraised at nothing and so awarded, and it is further,

ORDERED, That the Traffic Engineer, be and he is hereby directed to cause a sign to be placed on the above-named highway abandoned as aforesaid, having thereon the words, "Not a Public Highway", and it is further

ORDERED, That after the entry of this order or decree, the City Clerk shall cause a notice, thereof, to be published in a newspaper published in the County of Providence at least once a week for three successive weeks, and a further and personal notice shall be served by the City Sergeant upon every owner of land abutting the above-named highway which has been abandoned, who is known to reside within the State.

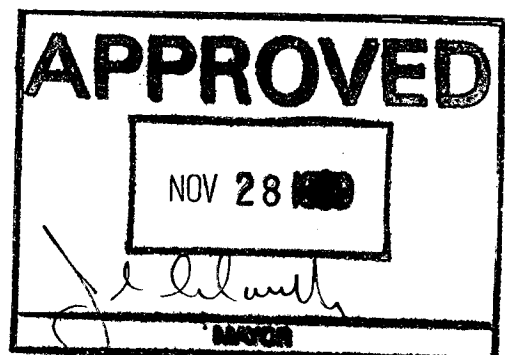

PETITION TO THE CITY COUNCIL

TO THE HONORABLE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE:

The undersigned respectfully petitions your honorable body

to consider my request for abandonment of Mississippi Avenue. This street is recorded on Plat #87 and shows as a paper street measuring 40 feet by 128 feet in the records at City Hall.

I am the new owner of the house at 1014 Narragansett Boulevard, my driveway abutts Mississippi Avenue.

One of the reoccurring problems is students and neighbors misjudge the boundries and as a result are parking directly in my driveway, blocking access to the rear entrance of my home.

Also, during my efforts to maintain my property, I have noticed the increasing volume of trash and beer bottles left either by owners of the cars parked on Mississippi Avenue overnight, or by teenagers who are drinking in the area. As a result, I find myself cleaning my property as well as Mississippi Avenue.

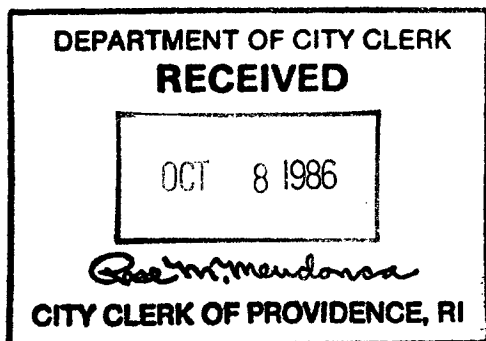
Another major concern of mine is that the street will slowly become a city dumping site. To substantiate my fears, there has been an abandoned car parked there since February and the trash problem has become increasingly worse.

I have spoken to Mr. Friedman, the owner of Paramount Resturaunt Supply, and he said neither he nor his brother would have any objections should you decide in my favor. The same holds true for Michael Marsh, the owner of the Shell Gas Station located on the south-erly side of Mississippi Avenue.

Should your honorable body decide in favor of abandonment, I would have the legal right to restrict any loitering or drinking on Mississippi Avenue, thus helping to contain the trash problem in the area. And I could have some recourse for the abandoned car situation. Last but not least be able to have unrestricted access to my driveway.

I am aware of the previous rejection for abandonment, however since that time there has been some changes to the street. Landfill has been brought in and an eight foot fence has been erected to prevent children and teenagers from loitering behind Paramount Rest-uraunt Supplies Warehouse, located directly at the end of the street. I am also aware of the drainage line and maintenance responsibility involved.

I do appreciate your time and consideration towards this important matter.

CPC REFERRAL NO. 2201 - Abandonment of Mississippi Avenue

A communication was received from the Committee on Public Works dated October 17, 1986 requesting the City Plan Commission's recommendations on the proposed abandonment of Mississippi Avenue from Narragansett Boulevard to its easterly terminus.

The petitioner is Mr. Gwen C. Altenbaugh of 1014 Narragansett Boulevard, Providence, Rhode Island, owner of adjacent property described as Assessor's lot 1061 on Plat 87.

A field inspection revealed that Mississippi Avenue is a dead end street, partially paved (approximately 50 feet from Narragansett Boulevard is paved) and used by the petitioner as a driveway to his property. The southern side of a paved portion is used as parking by neighborhood tenants.

The adjacent lot 1064 is occupied by the Shell Gas Station.

Behind the eastern terminus of Mississippi Avenue there is a steep embankment and the level of terrain drops approximately 40 ft. down.

Since the petitioner in his petition to the City Council acknowledged that he contacted all adjacent property owners and no objection was offered to his petition, the staff recommends that the Commission advise the Committee on City Property that no objection is offered to this abandonment.
