PRESENTATION OF ORDINANCE

COUNCILMAN CLARKIN, COUNCILWOMAN YOUNG and COUNCILMAN DeLUCA:

An Ordinance Requiring A.C. Powered/Battery Backup Smoke Detectors in each unit of housing with an installation cost of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) and the City is to Recoup the Cost of

Installation by downsizing the Fire Department by Two Hundred (200) Firefighters.

Referred to Committee on Finance, on motion of COUNCILMAN GLAVIN, seconded by COUNCILMAN LOMBARDI.

PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

COUNCILMAN CLARKIN requests to speak on a point of personal privilege and states:

"Last July, in a home on Admiral Street, two infants were killed in a fire. This was a tragedy that should have been avoided and it could have been avoided. Councilwoman Young, Councilman DeLuca and I have come up with a way to stop this loss of life and at the same time, save the taxpayers of this City Eighty-Seven Million Dollars (\$87,000,000.00) over Ten (10) years.

We have proposed this Ordinance to mandate Smoke Detectors in each unit of Housing in this City. Our Ordinance will have the City pay for the Detectors and for the installation of them. In order to recoup the cost of these Detectors, we will downsize the Fire Department by 200 firefighters. The City is presently advertising for more firefighters, supposedly for greater safety for the residents of this City. But, this is an illusion. This is a fallacy. To equate more firefighters with better safety, it is not so. If every firefighter in this City was located at the Admiral Street Fire Station last July, those two infants still would have died. All 539 firefighters on the Providence Fire Department, at a cost of \$50,000.00 per firefighter would not have saved those infants. But, our Smoke Detectors at a cost of \$15.00 each would have saved them.

This is the Modern Age, this is a High Tech Age. Smoke Detectors have been around for over 10 years and they are a proven safety factor.

Fire after fire, we hear that there were no smoke Detectors or we hear that the Batterys were removed. It is our feeling that the time is now for the City to bite the bullet and fund the installation of Detectors in each unit of housing in this City. We estimate the cost of this installation to be Thirteen Million Dollars (\$13,000,000.00). This is a one time cost. The City

will be able to recoup this cost in 1.3 years by downsizing the Fire Department by 200 firefighters.

Providence has a population of 160,000 people and an area of around 18 square miles to protect. Yet, we have more firefighters than Warwick, Cranston and Pawtucket combined. These three Cities have a combined population of 235,000 and a total area of 72 square miles to protect. We, in Providence, have 337 firefighters per 100,000 population. Warwick, Cranston and Pawtucket have on average 226 firefighters per 100,000 population.

In 1973, the City of Providence paid for a Comprehensive Study of the Fire Department. This study was updated in 1987. This report, known as the Gage/Babcock Report stated that the City should close Fire Stations and that we should cut our fire companies from 23 to 17. Instead, we have expanded this department. Our Fire Department is not an over-worked department. I even believe that some agoraphobic people in this City leave their house more than some of our Fire Companies leave their stations.

Let me give you a few facts. Engine 4 responded to 18 Code Red Fires last year. They only helped put out seven fires, the others were out by the time they got there. Ladder 7 attended 32 fires in the whole year. Engine 12 and Ladder 3 attended 42 fires and I say, attended because for most of the time they did not raise a ladder. This is far from being an over-worked department.

I call upon Mayor Cianci to cancel the upcoming Fire School and to use the money that would be wasted on unneeded firefighters and put Smoke Detectors immediately in those High Risk Fire

Areas of this City. Every unit of Housing in the West End, Upper and Lower South Providence could get Smoke Detectors installed for what these 35 Trainees will cost this City. Let us move into the Modern World. Let us protect our Citizens. Let us provide true Public Safety, not just illusions.

We have included in this Ordinance both a carrot — the \$200.00 Grant — and a Big Stick. Our Ordinance will have a fine of \$500.00 for any units not having Smoke Detectors and I know that some will say that we can't afford the Thirteen Million Dollar (\$13,000,000) estimated cost of this

project. But, in truth, there will be no cost, only a start up charge.

Having over 501 Firefighters on our Fire Department has absolutely nothing to do with safety. The only reason for this amount of manpower is the Empire Building that the Union Leaders of this Department are trying to do in this City and at the International Firefighters Union in Washington.

I ask you to consider this Ordinance. Help to put in place a true Public Safety System.
