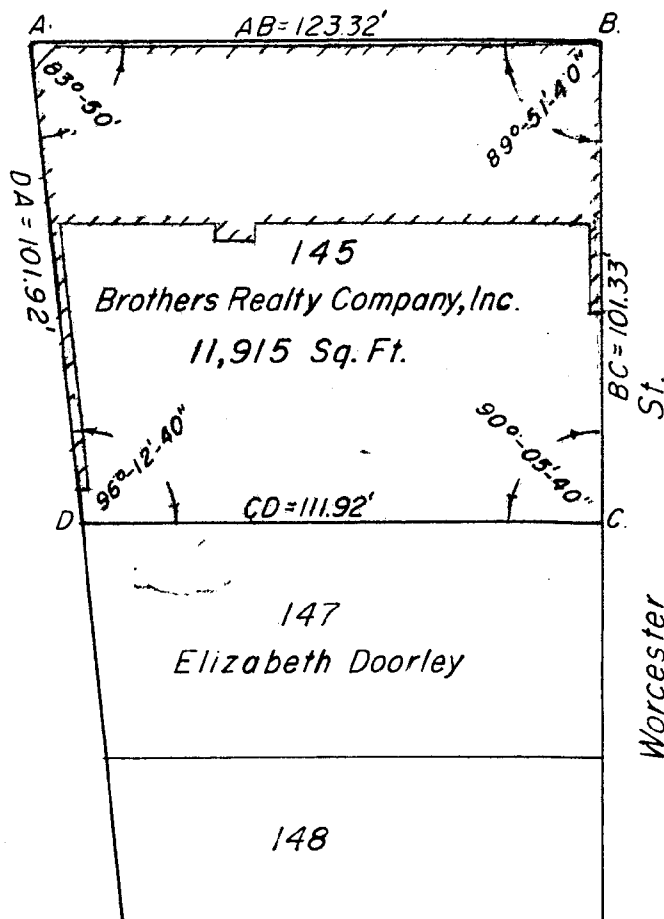

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved May 5, 1961.

Resolved,

That the City Council of the City of Providence hereby orders the assessment and collection of a tax on the ratable real estate and tangible personal property and ratable intangible personal property (the tax on ratable intangible property to be at the rate of forty cents on each one hundred dollars of the value thereof) in a sum not less than \$29,500,000 nor more than \$30,700,000; said tax is for ordinary expenses, charges and sinking funds, for the payment of interest and indebtedness in whole or in part of said City, and for other purposes authorized by law.

The City Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on the inhabitants and ratable property of said City as of the 31st day of December, A. D. 1960, at twelve o'clock, noon, Eastern Standard Time according to law, and shall, on completion of said assessment, date and sign the same, and shall make out and certify to the City Collector of the City of Providence, on or before the 15th day of June, A. D. 1961, a complete list of the names of the persons taxed and of the total value of all the real estate taxes to each person, also the amount of personal estate assessed against each person, and also the total amount of the tax assessed against each person on said real estate and personal estate, opposite the name of the person or persons assessed, the assessment of real estate and of personal estate to appear in separate columns in said list. Said tax shall be due and payable on and between the 1st day of October, next and the twenty-fourth day of October, A. D. 1961, next, and all taxes remaining unpaid on said last named day shall carry until collected a penalty at the rate of eight percentum per annum upon such unpaid taxes. Provided, however, said tax may be paid in four installments, the first install-

ment of twenty-five percentum on or before the twenty-fourth day of October, A. D. 1961, and the remaining installments as follows: Twenty-five percentum on the twenty-fourth day of January, A. D. 1962; Twenty-five per centum on the twenty-fourth day of April, A. D. 1962; and twenty-five percentum on the twenty-fourth day of July, A. D. 1962. Each installment of taxes, if paid on or before the last day of each installment period successively and in order, shall be free from any charge for interest. If the first installment or any succeeding installment of taxes is not paid by the last date of the respective installment period or periods as they occur, then the whole tax or remaining unpaid balance of the tax, as the case may be, shall immediately become due and payable and shall carry until collected a penalty at the rate of eight percentum per annum. The City Collector, shall by advertisement, in the public newspapers of the City, notify all persons assessed to pay their respective taxes at his office on and between the said 1st and twenty-fourth days of October, A. D. 1961, both days inclusive; said Collector shall attend daily during said periods, Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays excepted, at his office from nine o'clock A. M. to five o'clock P. M. to receive said taxes.

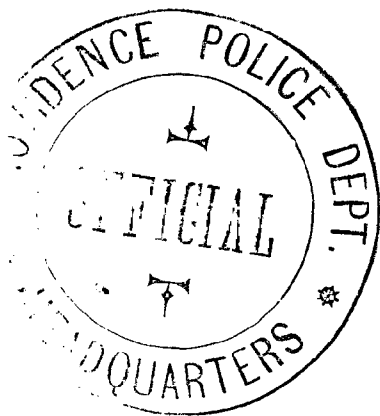

Whereas, this community has suffered an irreparable loss in the death of the Very Reverend Robert J. Slavin, O. P. who was called to his eternal reward on April 24, 1961, and

Whereas, Father Slavin, a native of Boston, who attended Providence College prior to his profession in the Dominican Order returned in 1947 to become the sixth president of Providence College and to direct the greatest expansion program in the history of the college. A doubled student enrollment requiring an expansion of the physical plant at a cost of several million dollars and the building of an expanded faculty were among the achievements of Father Slavin, whose administrative ability has placed Providence College in the top echelon of institutions of learning of this country, and

Whereas, Father Slavin whose intensive training and broad experience in the teaching profession eminently qualified him for the exalted position he achieved as one of the foremost educators in this country; he was also a noted orator and in constant demand as a speaker. He was the foe of communism and materialism and the champion of righteousness with which he sought constantly to impress his students.

Now, Therefore Be It Resolved, that Mayor Walter H. Reynolds and the members of this City Council, mindful of his innumerable contributions to the welfare of the people of this city and state and conscious of a deep debt of gratitude which is due him; hereby pay honor and respect to the memory of a cultured gentlemen, a kindly advisor, an outstanding educator, an astute administrator and a zealous churchman, Very Reverend Robert J. Slavin, O. P., President of Providence College.
