

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 409

Approved May 8, 1975

WHEREAS, the Armenian Community of our State in memory of the 60th Anniversary of the massacre, by the Turkish Government, of One Million and One Half Armenians held commemoration rites on April 24, 1975, and

WHEREAS, in that brutal genocide of April 24, 1915, a date indelibly etched in the history of the Armenian People, freedom-loving people throughout the World offer their hearts to that race of People whose culture has enhanced the known civilized World, and

WHEREAS, in paying honor to the memory of those who were martyred on April 24, 1915, the prayers of peace of this community are offered to their survivors.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in commemoration of the 60th Anniversary of the slaying of those martyred Armenians, the City Council does hereby pause and offer their prayers with the fervent hope that never again will history record such a useless dissemination of a cultured people, whose contribution to the development of our great country is well-established and respected, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon the adoption of this Resolution by the City Council and its' approval by His Honor the Mayor, the City Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a duly engrossed copy to the United Armenian Committee, which conducted the commemorative rites, that it will be informed of this expression, condemnation of that infamous near annihilation by the Turkish Government.
