An Ordinance Amending Section 1 of Chapter 103 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1948, Entitled, "An Ordinance Designating 17 Areas of Land in the City of Providence as Redevelopment Areas in Accordance with the Provisions of Section 22 of Chapter 1802 of the Public Laws, 1946, known as the Community Redevelopment Act" as Amended, Relative to the Silver Lake Revitalization Project.

Be It Ordained By The City Of Providence:

Section 1. Section 1 of Chapter 103 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1948, entitled, "An Ordinance Designating 17 Areas of Land in the City of Providence as Redevelopment Areas in Accordance with the Provisions of Section 22 of Chapter 1802 of the Public Laws, 1946, known as the "Community Redevelopment Act" as amended is hereby further amended as follows:

A. Insert the following area description at the end of the area description set forth under the heading "Redevelopment Area D-5:

That certain parcel of land situated on the

easterly side of Heath Street, the southerly side of Syracuse Street the easterly side of Laurel Hill Avenue, the southerly side of Grover Street, the southerly side of Nye Street, the easterly side of Petters Avenue, the southerly side of Killingly Street, the easterly side of Duxbury Street, the southerly side of Plainfield Street, the easterly side of Daniel Avenue, the easterly side of Ethan Street, the southerly side of Farmington Avenue, the easterly side of Libia Street, the northerly side of the Providence/Cranston City line, the southerly side of the Providence/Cranston City line, the westerly highway line of I-195, the westerly side of Harris Avenue, the northerly side of Broadway, the easterly side of Valley Street, the northerly side of SanSouci Drive, the northerly side of Manton Avenue, the southerly side of Bosworth Street, and the westerly highway line of I-195 in the City of Providence, County of Providence, State of Rhode Island, being bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point, said point being located at the center line intersections of Hartford Avenue and Health Street;

thence running southerly along the said center line of Heath Street to its intersection with the rear lot lines of the lots located on the northerly side of Eastwood Avenue;

thence turning and running westerly along the said rear lot lines of the northerly side of Eastwood Avenue to the easterly termination of Cleveland Street;

thence turning and running northerly along the easterly lines of Lots 272, 248 and 399 to the southerly line of Syracuse Street;

thence turning and running westerly along the southerly line of Syracuse Street a distance of 80.00' \pm to a corner;

thence turning and running northerly to the center line of Syracuse Street;

thence turning and running westerly along the

center line of Syracuse Street to the center line intersection of Laurel Hill Avenue and Syracuse Street;

thence turning and running southwesterly along the center line to Laurel Hill Avenue to the center line intersection of Grover Street and Laurel Hill Avenue;

thence turning and running along the center line of Grover Street to a point opposite the westerly property line of Lot 54 on A.P. 107;

thence turning and running northerly along the aforesaid lot line to the northwesterly corner of said lot;

thence turning and running westerly along the southerly line of Lot 38 to the center line located at the southerly termination of Ida Street;

thence turning and running northerly along the center line of Ida Street to the center line intersection of Ida and Nye Street;

thence turning and running westerly along the center line of Nye Street to the center line intersection of Nye Street and Petteys Avenue;

thence turning and running southerly along the center line of Petteys Avenue to the center line intersection of Killingly Street and Petteys Avenue;

thence turning and running westerly along the said center line of Killingly Street to the intersection with the westerly street line of Duxbury Street;

thence turning and running southerly along the said westerly line of Duxbury Street to the center line intersection of Plainfield Street;

thence turning and running easterly along the center line of Plainfield Street to the center line intersection with Daniel Avenue;

thence turning and running southeasterly

along the center line of Daniel Avenue to the intersection of the center line of Ethan Street;

thence turning and running southwesterly along the center line of said Ethan Street to the center line intersection with Farmington Avenue;

thence turning and running westerly along the said center line of Farmington Avenue to the center line intersection with Libia Street;

thence turning and running southerly along the said center line of Libia Street to its intersection with the Providence/Cranston City line;

thence turning and running easterly and southerly along the said Providence Cranston City line to its intersection with the westerly State Highway line of Interstate 195;

thence turning and running in a general northerly direction along the said westerly highway line of Interstate 195 to its intersection with the northerly termination of Harris Avenue;

thence turning and running southerly along the center line of Harris Avenue to its intersection with the center line of Broadway;

thence turning and running westerly along the said center line of Broadway to its center line intersection with Valley Street;

thence turning and running northerly along the said center line of Valley Street to its center line intersection with SanSouci Drive;

thence turning and running in a general westerly direction along the center line of SanSouci Drive to its center line intersection with Manton Avenue;

thence turning and running in a general northwesterly direction along the said center line of Manton Avenue to the center line intersection with Bosworth Street;

thence turning and running in a general southwesterly direction along the said center line of Bosworth Street to its intersection with the said westerly highway line of Interstate 195;

thence turning and running in a general southerly direction along the said westerly highway line of Route 195 to its intersection with the center line of Hartford Avenue;

thence turning and running westerly along the said center line of said Hartford Avenue to the point and place of beginning.

Sec. 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon the passage.

An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for the Silver Lake Revitalization Project.

Be It Ordained By The City Of Providence:

Whereas, The Providence Redevelopment Agency, (hereinafter sometimes called "Local Public Agency") pursuant to the provisions of Title 45, Chapter 31-33 (inclusive) of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, as amended, entitled, "Redevelopment Act of 1956", has formulated and submitted to the City Council on July 1, 1982 for its consideration, an Urban Renewal Plan approved by the Local Public Agency, for an Urban Renewal Area, which said Urban Renewal Plan is entitled, "Silver Lake Revitalization Project" and comprises a report consisting of approximately 30 pages of text, exhibit and maps; and

Whereas, A general plan has been prepared by the City Plan Commission and is recognized and used as a guide for the general development of the City of Providence as a whole; and

Whereas, The said Urban Renewal Plan

concerns itself with areas which have been designated Redevelopment Areas by the City Council of the City of Providence by Chapter 103 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved July 6, 1948, as amended by Chapter 69-44 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved November 28, 1969, in conformity with the provisions of Section 22 of Chapter 1802 of the Public Laws of Rhode Island 1946, as amended, and Title 45, Chapter 32, Section 4 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, as amended; and

Whereas, A copy of said Urban Renewal Plan was transmitted to the City Plan Commission on June 21, 1982.

Whereas, The City Plan Commission, which is the duly designated and acting official planning body for the City, has submitted to the City Council its report and recommendations respecting the Urban Renewal Plan for the Silver Lake Revitalization Project and has certified that said Urban Renewal Plan conforms to the said general plan for the City as a whole, and the City Council has duly considered said report, recommendations and certification of the planning body; and

Whereas, The plan as submitted contains a finding that the area included in the proposed Urban Renewal Plan qualified as a deteriorated blighted area within the meaning of the "Redevelopment Act of 1956" as amended to date, because there exist in the area buildings or improvements, used or intended to be used for living, commercial, industrial or other purposes, which by reason of (1) dilapidation, deterioration, age or obsolescence, (2) inadequate provisions for ventilation, light, sanitation, open spaces and recreation facilities, (3) defective design or unsanitary or unsafe character of condition, (4) defective or inadequate street and lot layout, (5) mixed character, deterioration or shifting of uses to which they are put, or any combination of such factors and characteristics are conducive to the further deterioration and decline of the area and injuriously affect the entire area; and

Whereas, A structural quality survey was conducted by the City of Providence, Department of Planning and Urban Development and the results of that survey as set forth in the Urban Renewal Plan indicated that 3.52% of the structures have deficiencies that include serious deterioration; lack of sanitary facilities; and serious inadequacies in lighting and ventilation. The Silver Lake Revitalization Project Area is not restricted to, nor does it consist entirely of lands, buildings, or improvements which of themselves are detrimental, but is an area in which such conditions exist and injuriously affect the entire area.

Whereas, There has also been presented to the City Council information and data respecting Urban Renewal Plans for the Urban Renewal Areas in the City of Providence including the following: Capital Improvement Programs for 1950-1956, 1951-1957, 1952-1958, 1953-1959, 1954-1960, 1955-1961, 1956-1962, 1957-1963, 1958-1964, 1959-1965, 1960-1966, and 1961-1967, 1962-1968, 1963-1969, 1964-1970, 1965-1971, 1966-1972, 1967-1973, 1968-1974, 1979-1985, 1980-1986 and the Annual Reports of the Providence Redevelopment Agency for 1948 through 1980 (inclusive); and

Whereas, At a public hearing held following notice of the date, time, place and purposes of such hearing, the City Council Committee on Urban Redevelopment, Renewal and Planning duly considered the Urban Renewal Plan, and all evidence and testimony for and against the adoption of such plan, in accordance with the provisions of the "Redevelopment Act of 1956"; and

Whereas, Said Urban Renewal Plan for the Project Area prescribes certain land uses for the Silver Lake Revitalization Project Area and will require, among other things, but not by way of limitation, property acquisition clearance and demolition, rehabilitation and reconstruction of certain streets, curbs and sidewalks, grading and other public improvements and other public actions; and

Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained By The City Of Providence:

1. The Project is hereby designated as "Silver Lake Revitalization Project".

2. It is hereby found and determined that for the purpose of the Urban Renewal Plan, the Silver Lake Revitalization Project comprises that certain tract of land situated in the City of Providence and State of Rhode Island, which is bounded as described in Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and made apart hereof as if more fully set forth herein.

3. It be and hereby is found and determined in relation to the Silver Lake Revitalization Project on the basis of the facts set forth in the report and documents mentioned in the Preamble of this Ordinance and upon the basis of evidence and testimony presented at the public hearing on said plan.

(a) That within the Silver Lake Revitalization Project Area 1.00% of the structures are substandard or seriously deficient or unsafe in that these structures contain serious deterioration, and

(b) Within the Silver Lake Revitalization Project Area there exists the following environmental deficiencies:

a. Defective or inadequate street and/or lot layout.

b. Incompatible or Shifting Uses.

c. Obsolete or Aged Buildings, Not Suitable for Improvement or Conversion.

d. Inadequate Provision for Ventilation, Light, Sanitation, Open Space and Recreation Facilities.

e. Defective Design or Unsanitary or Unsafe Character or Condition of Physical Construction.

4. It be and hereby is found and determined that because of a predominance of conditions of dilapidation, deterioration, obsolescence, inadequate provision for light and sanitation, unsanitary and unsafe character and condition of physical construction, mixed character of uses injuriously affect the entire area and constitute a menace to the public health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the area and of the community generally, said Urban Renewal Area is a deteriorated and blighted area within the meaning of Sections 2-8 inclusive of Chapter 31 of the "Redevelopment Act of 1956", as amended, and that said Silver Lake Revitalization Project Area is hereby determined to be deteriorated blighted area.

5. It be and hereby is found that the Silver Lake Revitalization Project Area requires clearance, replanning, redevelopment, and improvement and rehabilitation under the provisions of the "Redevelopment Act of 1956".

6. It be and hereby is declared to be the purpose and intent of this Body to eliminate the deteriorated and substandard conditions existing in the Silver Lake Revitalization Project Area and the replacement of such conditions by a well-planned area in accordance with and by the means provided in the "Redevelopment Act of 1956".

7. It is hereby found, declared and determined that:

(a) The Urban Renewal Plan for the Silver Lake Revitalization Project Area will redevelop said Urban Renewal Area in conformity with the provisions of the "Redevelopment Act of 1956" will effectuate the purposes and policy of said Act; and will promote the public health, safety, morals and welfare of the City of Providence.

(b) The Urban Renewal Plan for said Urban Renewal Area conforms to the general or master plan for the City of Providence as a whole.

(c) The acquisition of the real property in

accordance with said Plan for the Silver Lake Revitalization Project Area is in the public interest.

(d) Adequate provision for payment for property which may be acquired by the exercise of eminent domain has been made in the Urban Renewal Plan.

(e) The Urban Renewal Plan contains adequate safeguards to assure the carrying out of the work of redevelopment in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan.

(f) The Urban Renewal Plan provides for the retention of controls and the establishment of restrictions and covenants which may run with the land.

8. The Providence Redevelopment Agency shall sell, lease or dispose of land in the Silver Lake Revitalization Project Area only in accordance with the terms of the Redevelopment Plan and subject to the restrictions, covenants and conditions set forth herein and which are hereby found and declared to be necessary to effectuate the purposes of the "Redevelopment Act of 1956".

9. In enacting this Ordinance, the City Council intends to comply with the provisions of the "Redevelopment Act of 1956" which relates to adoption of an Urban Renewal Plan for an approved Urban Renewal Area so that the blighted and substandard conditions in this Urban Renewal Area can be eliminated and the Urban Renewal Area can be redeveloped in accordance with the Urban Renewal Plan to attain the public purposes and policy of the "Redevelopment Act of 1956" and thereby to protect and promote and be in the interest of the public health, safety, morals and general welfare of the people in the State as a whole and particularly the people of this City.

10. The Urban Renewal Plan for the Silver Lake Revitalization Project consisting of a booklet containing a table of contents,

approximately 30 pages of text, exhibit and maps, is hereby approved, adopted and designated as the Official Redevelopment Plan for the Silver Lake Revitalization Project and is herein incorporated by reference, and made a part hereof.

11. The Providence Redevelopment Agency is hereby fully authorized to carry out this Official Redevelopment Plan, however, that the Agency shall not enter into any contracts for disposition of property in the Urban Renewal Project Area until at least ten days after the City Council of the City of Providence has received at a regular or special meeting a report from the Providence Redevelopment Agency concerning the proposed sale or lease.

12. In order to implement and facilitate the effecuation of the Urban Renewal Plan hereby approved, it is found and determined that certain official action must be taken by this Body.

(a) Pledges its cooperation in helping to carry out said Official Urban Renewal Plan;

(b) Requests the various officials, departments, boards, and agencies of the City of Providence having administrative responsibilities in the premises likewise to cooperate to such end and to exercise their respective functions and powers in a manner consistent with said Urban Renewal Plan;

(c) Declares that it will provide the cost of the redevelopment of the Urban Renewal Project Area, and hereby allocates a cash contribution of \$867,750.00 representing the estimated amount of the Project Cost;

(d) That the City Treasurer, acting under the direction of the Committee on Finance, be and hereby is authorized and directed to borrow from time to time, in such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding Eight Hundred Sixty Seven Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty and 00/100 (\$867.750.00) Dollars in accordance with the provisions of Title 45, Chapter 32, Section 42, and

Title 45, Chapter 33, Sections 1, 2, 4, and 17 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, entitled, "Redevelopment Act of 1956", and to issue the City's notes therefore, signed by him and countersigned by the Mayor and the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and to renew any such notes from time to time as the same become due. The money thus obtained shall be used exclusively for carrying out the Official Redevelopment Plan for the Silver Lake Revitalization Project.

(e) Stands ready to consider and take appropriate action upon any other proposals and measures designed to effectuate said Urban Renewal Plan.

13. This Ordinance shall take effect on its passage and shall be filed with the City Clerk who is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Providence Redevelopment Agency.

An Ordinance in Amendment of and in Addition to Chapter 1977-5 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, Approved February 14, 1977 and Entitled, "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for Downtown Providence Renewal" for the Additional Cost of Kennedy Plaza Project, Revised Conceptual Plan and Management Provisions.

Be It Ordained By The City of Providence:

1. That Chapter 1977-5 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved February 14, 1977 and entitled, "An Ordinance Approving and Adopting the Official Redevelopment Plan for Downtown Providence Renewal" as amended by Chapter 1978-44 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved November 24, 1978, as amended by Chapter 1981-26 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved May 21, 1981

and as amended by Chapter 1981-50 of the Ordinance of the City of Providence, approved October 23, 1981, be and the same is hereby further amended as follows:

A. Add the title "I. Maintenance of Public Improvements" following title "H. Procedure for Changes in Approved Plan" in the *Table of Contents* as contained in and set forth in that booklet entitled, "Downtown Providence Renewal, Official Redevelopment Plan, 1976" which is a part of the aforementioned ordinance.

B. Paragraph numbered 7, entitled, "Estimated Cost of Redevelopment and Proposed Method of Finance" under Section G. entitled "*Other Provisions Necessary to Meet Local Objectives*" as contained in and set forth in Page 23 of that certain booklet entitled, "Downtown Providence Renewal, Official Redevelopment Plan, 1976" which is a part of the aforementioned ordinance be and the same is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefore:

7. Estimated Cost of Redevelopment and Proposed Method of Financing

Line 1 \$1,200,000 — Cost of acquiring the parking deck fronting Union Station (\$500,000) and the former Journal Building at 205 Westminster Mall. (\$700,000.00)

Line 2 \$6,675,720 — Kennedy Plaza Capital Improvements. (original cost \$4,906,000 plus additional cost \$1,769,720)

Line 3 \$4,624,000 — Capital Center Improvement.
