RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 237

Approved April 15, 1977

WHEREAS, that wooded area of Blackstone Park, from its entrance at York Pond along River Road, is one of a limited number of such City sylvan retreats open to pedestrians to enjoy, and

WHEREAS, this natural "Glen in the City", affords a pleasant departure from the asphalt pavements, synonymous with Urban residency, therefore should be preserved for its original purpose, and

WHEREAS, the sponsors of this Resolution, Councilman Thomas W. Pearlman and Councilman William G. Bradshaw have received numerous complaints of motor cyclists traversing that Park area, in violation of an order by the Board of Park Commissioners and signed, excluding motor vehicles from traveling on this area, said signs having however, mysteriously disappeared,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Park Commissioners is requested to cause appropriate signs to be installed at the entrance to Blackstone Park, at York Pond, indicating "Motor Vehicles Prohibited - Pedestrians Only".
