WHEREAS, Sammy Sykes of 39 Althea Street, an employee of John J. Orr & Son, Inc., was critically injured at the Port of Providence,

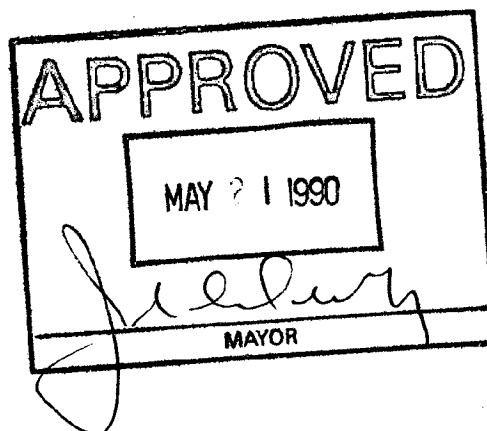
