RESOLVED,

That the North End Businessmen's Association be granted the privilege of erecting light decorations and related Christmas decorations for the 1965 Christmas Season along and over and across certain streets as may be incorporated in said Association's plans, all subject to the approval of the Director of Public Works and the Public Service Engineer; provided that the North End Businessmen's Association shall furnish to the City and file with the City Clerk, prior to the erection of any of the foregoing, a liability insurance policy certificate, approved as to form by the City Solicitor its limits to be not less than One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000) Dollars and Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000) Dollars in public liability and Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000) Dollars property damage, indemnifying the City against any claim arising out of any damage due to the erection, maintenance and/or removal of any decorations or parts thereof.
