



No. **AN ORDINANCE** IN AMENDMENT OF AND IN ADDITION
TO SECTION 17-7 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE
CITY OF PROVIDENCE, ENTITLED: "EMPLOYEES TO BE RESI-
DENTS; EXCEPTIONS," AS AMENDED.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Section 17-7 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence, entitled: "Employees to be Residents; Exceptions," is hereby amended to read as follows:

(a) No person shall be hired to work as an employee or officer in any of the departments of the City government, including the School Department, Department of Public Safety, and all agencies and instrumentalities thereof, unless such person be a resident of the City as defined in § 1210 of the Home Rule Charter; provided that this section shall not apply (1) when upon certification by the Mayor that after diligent search no person with proper qualifications can be found to fill a particular position among residents of the City, the City Council exempts a non-resident employee from the provisions of this section; and (2) that any person not a resident of the City may be appointed or engaged for employment on the condition that within six (6) months of such appointment or engagement, he or she shall become a resident of the City, all in accordance with § 1210 of the Home Rule Charter.

(b) Proof of residency. Prior to the hiring of any City employee, no fewer than three (3) items of documentary proof of his or her residence within the City of Providence shall be required; photostatic reproductions of documentary proof shall be enclosed within the employee's personnel file. Examples of such documentary proof shall include but not be limited to the following: driver's license, telephone bill, utility bill, heating bill,

tax bill, motor vehicle registration, income tax returns, credit cards, insurance policies, and bank books; provided that no applicant or employee shall be required to produce any documents, including those hereinbefore listed, which are otherwise privileged or confidential.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its Passage.
