

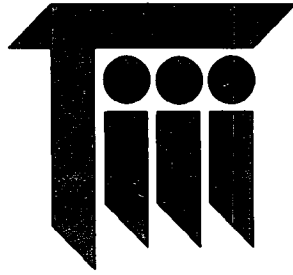


Dear Rose,

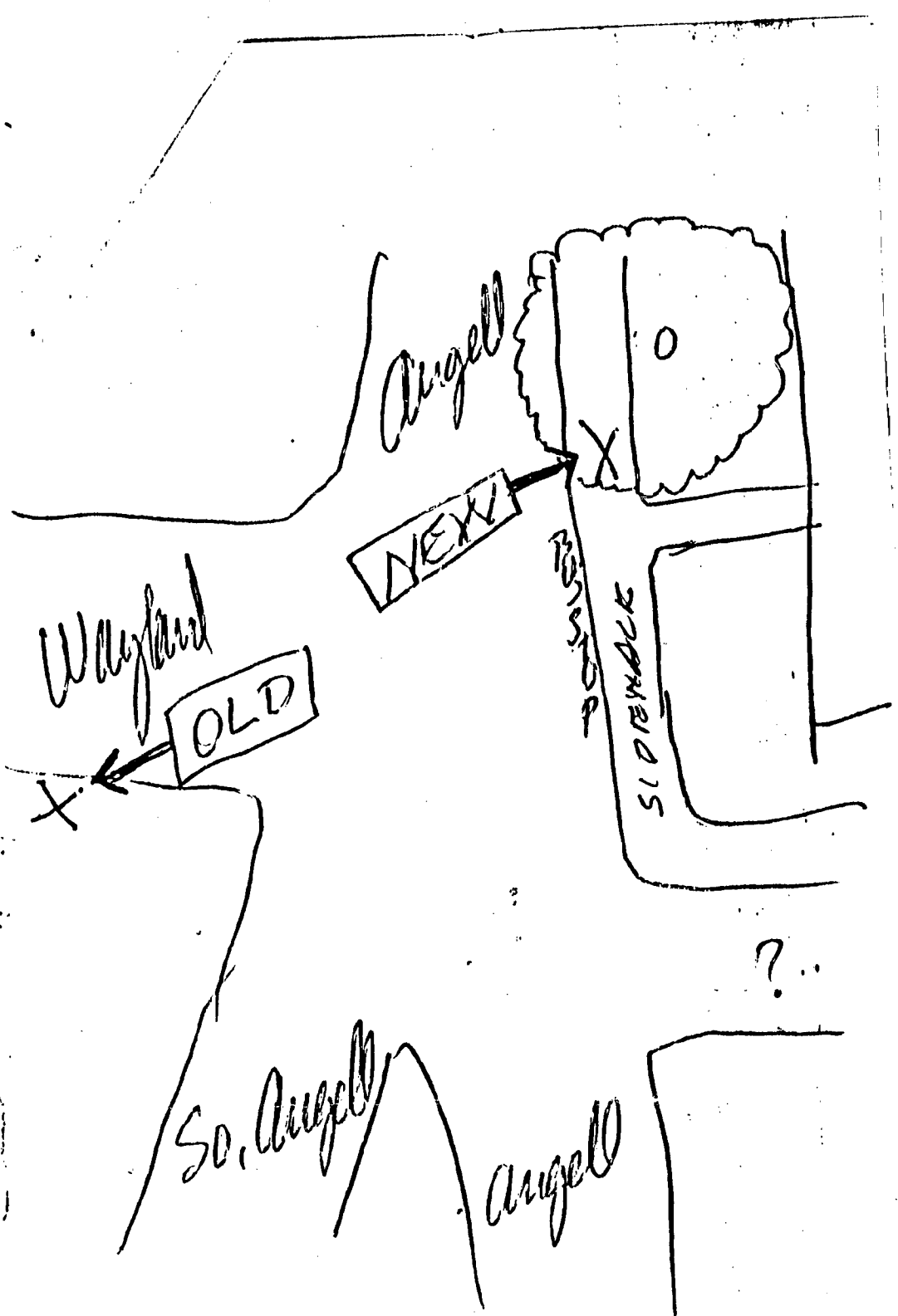
