ORDINANCES SECOND READING

The following Ordinance was in City Council July 2, 1992 Read and Passed the first time and is returned for passage the second time:

An Ordinance Authorizing the issuance of Refunding Bonds not to exceed Twenty-Nine Million Dollars (\$29,000,000.00)

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. A sum not in excess of \$29,000,000 shall be borrowed for the purpose of refunding the City's \$15,000,000 General Obligation School Bonds dated January 15, 1988 and the City's \$20,040,000 General Obligation Bonds dated

August 15, 1986. The City Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor and the Committee of Finance, is authorized to sell at either public or private sale refunding bonds not in excess of \$29,000,000, pursuant to Section 45-12-5.2 of the General laws and other laws applicable thereto, to determine and approve the manner of sale, denominations, interest rates and other terms and conditions of the bonds, and to issue the bonds.

Read by COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS, by the approval of the Mayor and the Committee of Finance, is authorized to sell at either public or private sale refunding bonds not in excess of \$29,000,000, pursuant to Section 45-12-5.2 of the General laws and other laws applicable thereto, to determine and approve the manner of sale, denominations, interest rates and other terms and conditions of the bonds, and to issue the bonds.
