

Dear Ms. Mendonca:

I am in receipt of the two City Resolutions regarding the Rhode Island Public Transit Authority (No's 171 and 172) that were forwarded to us from your office.

RIPTA is presently operating bus service on Prairie Avenue every forty minutes weekdays and Saturdays and every 30 minutes weekdays during peak ridership times. Ridership is averaging 8 passengers per trip. Thus, additional service on this line is not warranted and is not planned in the near future.

Resolution #172 involves the installation of a bus shelter at 520 Hope Street. This location has been reviewed by our Safety Department and is recommended as a good location for a shelter. We will be constructing a shelter at this location when the funding for new shelters is received from the Urban Mass Transportation Administration and the Rhode Island Department of Transportation.

In May of 1986, I wrote to you describing the necessity of a bus shelter for our patients at 520 Hope Street in Providence (see attached).

I received a quick response letter from Mr. Frederick J. Brown advising that there were no shelters available and that our request would be given every consideration when shelters became available. Eight (8) months have now passed and I am requesting an update. Our situation is still critical.

I hope this request can be expedited. I am very concerned about the safety of our patients, many of whom are taking medication, when they are forced to run from the building to the bus stop in inclement weather to catch the bus.

If you have any questions or need further justification, I would be happy to meet with you or Mr. Brown at your convenience.

The Providence Center for Counseling and Psychiatric Services is a non-profit community mental health center which primarily serves greater Providence area residents.

RIPTA is used by the majority of our clientele as their only source of travel to and from the Center. In addition, area residents and staff utilize the bus stop located in front of our building at 520 Hope Street, Providence.


We would like to request that a shelter be installed at the current bus stop in order to protect RIPTA passengers during inclement weather. Presently, our clients wait in the building on bad days until they see the bus coming and then try to run down the stairs and an additional fifty (50) feet to the bus stop. This is particularly dangerous since a high percentage of our clients are taking medication to manage their particular problem. Often, they miss the bus or chase it down the street unsuccessfully.

The installation of a shelter will greatly help the high volume of passengers who board at 520 Hope Street and will alleviate the potentially hazardous situation which now exists.

I hope you will assign a high priority to this request. If you have any questions, or would like to discuss this matter in greater detail, please don't hesitate to call me.
