CHAPTER 1747

No. 116 AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF SECTION 1, CHAPTER 716 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, 1929 PROHIBITING DISTRIBUTION OF PRINTED MATTER.

Approved February 24, 1966

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of Chapter 716 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved June 5, 1929, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"No person shall distribute, or cause to be distributed, any handbill, circular, program or slip of a commercial nature in or upon any Street, Highway, Mall, Plaza or Public Place within the City.

No person shall stand in or upon any Street, Highway, Mall, Plaza or Public Place within the City or in the entrance or hallway of any building in the City for the purpose of calling the attention of any person in the Street, Highway, Mall, Plaza or Public Place to goods, wares or merchandise displayed or on sale or to business conducted within any building."

SECTION 2. The penalty for the violation of this Ordinance shall be that provided in Section 10 of Chapter I of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1946.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
