WHEREAS, Section 44-18-36.1 of the Rhode Island General Laws was amended in the 2000 session of the Rhode Island General Assembly to increase the Hotel Motel Room Tax from five percent (5%) to six percent (6%), and

WHEREAS, This additional one percent (1%) increase was to be allocated for the establishment of a Heritage Museum in the City of Providence, and

WHEREAS, Inasmuch as the funding of the Heritage Museum was voted down by the Rhode Island electorate in November, 2000, this additional one percent (1%) in the Hotel Motel Room Tax is now an unallocated revenue in the State Budget, and

WHEREAS, Senator Teresa Paiva Weed (et.al.) has introduced Senate Bill 0071 which provides that this additional one percent (1%) of the Hotel Motel Room Tax be distributed to the communities in which the hotel that generated the tax is located.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Providence expresses its support of 2001-S 0071 and requests the City's Legislative Delegation to strive for its passage.

WHEREAS, Legislation has been introduced into the 2001 session of the Rhode Island General Assembly that would increase the annual payment in lieu of taxes (PILOT) appropriation to cities and towns for certain exempt private and state properties, and

WHEREAS, Passage of this bill would increase the annual PILOT appropriation in Fiscal Year 2001 from twenty seven (27 %) percent to thirty five (35 %) percent of all tax that would have been collected had the property been taxable, and

WHEREAS, This increased funding will help offset the losses in property tax revenue that communities experience due to qualifying facilities, such as non-profit institutions of higher learning and non-profit hospitals, being located within their boundaries.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That The City Council of the City of Providence strongly supports passage of legislation that would increase the PILOT appropriation to thirty five (35%) of all tax that would have been collected had the property been taxable.
