Resolution Requesting to abandon a portion of Crout Street.

RESOLVED, DECREED AND ORDERED:

That the cross-hatched portion of CROUT STREET shown on the accompanying plan entitled "Providence, R.I., P.W. Dept & Engineering Office, Street Line Section Plan No. 064861, dated May 22, 2019," bounded by letters the A-B-C-D-A on said plan, having ceased to be useful to the public, is proposed to be abandoned as a Public Highway. Said Abandonment is specifically conditioned upon the following:

1. Petitioners shall tender the amount of Fifty-Eight Thousand One Hundred Dollars (\$58,100.00) to the City of Providence.
2. Petitioners shall have a Class I survey prepared by a Professional Land Surveyor, properly licensed by the Board of Registration for Professional Land Surveyors, inasmuch as road abandonments constitute a boundary change pursuant to Informational Bulletin 2003.01 issued by said Board.
3. Any and all facilities owned by the City, including sewer utilities, but excluding facilities owned and/or operated by Providence Water, shall transfer to the Petitioners based on the lot lines determined by the aforementioned Class I survey. Responsibility for and liability from said facilities shall be that of the new property owners, including for maintenance and upkeep.
4. Petitioners shall grant any easement as may be required by Providence Water and Verizon as may be acceptable to both Petitioner and the respective utility.
5. Petitioners shall comply with all conditions contained herein within sixty (60) days from the date of passage.
6. Such other terms and conditions as may be reflected in the record and minutes of the City Council Committee on Public Works, and/or as may be deemed appropriate by the Mayor or the Department of Law.

ORDERED, That the Traffic Engineer be and is hereby directed to cause a sign to be placed on the above-named highway abandoned as aforesaid, having thereon the words, "Not a Public Highway," and it is further

ORDERED, That after the entry of this order or decree the City Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published in a newspaper published in the County of Providence at least once a week for three successive weeks and a further and personal notice shall be served by the City Sergeant upon every owner of land abutting the above-named highway which has been abandoned who is known to reside within the State.

Resolution Endorsing and Urging Passage by the General Assembly of House Bill 2022
H-7760, An Act Relating to State Affairs and Government - Restrictive Housing at
Correctional Facilities Act.

WHEREAS, Solitary confinement is typically defined as the act of being confined in a cell of 80 square feet or smaller for between 22 to 24 hours a day; and

WHEREAS, In 2015, the Association of State Correctional Administrators (ASCA) undertook a nationwide study to document the number of incarcerated persons placed in solitary confinement and the conditions they face. The study revealed that forty-two jurisdictions do not limit the duration of solitary confinement and that some fail to record the length of time that an individual is held in segregation; and

WHEREAS, There has been an abuse of authority in Rhode Island prisons leading to many individuals experiencing up to 7 years straight of solitary confinement which resulted in physical and mental anguish and separation from families and friends; and

WHEREAS, Long-term solitary confinement causes severe harm to mental health such as increased rates of anxiety, obsessive ruminations, anger, and depression, as well as increased violence in prisons; and

WHEREAS, House Bill H - 7760 aims to establish conditions, policies, and procedures for the restrictive housing of inmates at correctional facilities in Rhode Island with the least restrictive conditions possible. The guidelines and restrictions for disciplinary confinement should include transitional disciplinary confinement, and step-down housing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Providence City Council hereby supports and urges passage of House Bill H - 7760, An Act Relating to State Affairs and Government - Restrictive Housing at Correctional Facilities Act.

Resolution Condemning the United States Supreme Court's opinion on Roe V. Wade.

WHEREAS, Roe v. Wade, 410 U.S. 113, was a landmark decision of the U.S. Supreme Court in which the Court ruled that the Constitution of the United States protects a pregnant woman's liberty to choose to have an abortion without excessive government restriction; and

WHEREAS, The United States Supreme Court has recently drafted an opinion aimed to overturn Roe v. Wade; and

WHEREAS, Across the world, women are relentlessly advocating for personal autonomy over their own bodies and yet this opinion seeks to strip women of their right to choose; and

WHEREAS, In light of this pending decision from the United States Supreme Court, it is imperative that political leaders across the country work to codify the fundamental right to personal autonomy at the State and Federal level.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Providence hereby condemns the United States Supreme Court's opinion to overturn the Roe v. Wade decision.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Providence supports and urges passage of House Bill - 7442 and its companion Senate Bill S - 2549, An Act Relating to State Affairs and Government - Health Care for Children and Pregnant Women - Equality in Abortion Coverage, that would provide for abortion coverage exclusion for state employee insurance plans.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That upon passage, copies of this resolution be transmitted to the Honorable United States Supreme Court Justices, President Joe Biden, the Rhode Island Supreme Court, and the Rhode Island Delegation, the Providence Delegation, the Speaker of the House and the Senate President.
