Gentlemen:

Resolution No. 604 of the City of Providence dated December 23, 1966, memorializes the Housing Assistance Administration to permit the Providence Housing Authority to develop more units for senior citizen housing. The resolution was passed on the assumption, apparently, that the Housing Assistance Administration has advised the Authority that no further application will be entertained.

We have been concerned with the large number of vacancies in various federally aided developments in the city and numerous discussions have been held with the Authority to effect a plan to reduce these vacancies. One of the plans now under consideration involves a conversion of dwellings in Roger Williams Houses from nonelderly to elderly usage. In view of this possibility, we requested the Authority to study its application file and to send in a study of the need for additional units for the elderly. The apparent need for additional units in Providence has not been questioned. We are sure you will concur, however, in our reluctance to commit additional federal funds until the vexing and costly vacancy situation is satisfactorily disposed of.

We wish to assure you that we will continue to work with the Authority in its endeavors to provide satisfactory housing for the ill-housed, low-income families of Providence.
