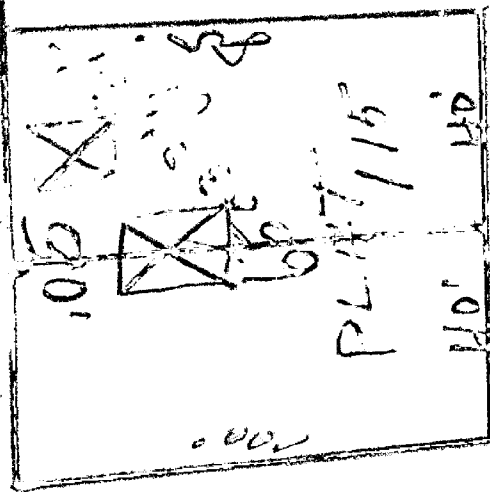

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, August 9, 1960.

This referral is a request to change Lots 238 and 239 on Assessor's Plat 115 from an R-1 Single-Family Zone to a C-4 Heavy Commercial Zone; said lots being located at the corner of Hartford Avenue and Wright Street. The property in question contains 6,503 square feet of land.


It was determined on an inspection and photographic survey that the premises contained a 2½-story frame dwelling and a 2-stall private masonry garage - both in need of repair.

The granting of this petition would introduce a case of spot zoning on a site which is fronting on a main artery that is seriously overloaded with traffic and that has more than ample Commercial Zoning. Since it would be undesirable to introduce a spot commercial operation in a location which has inadequate facilities for off-street parking,


