No. 233 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE

CHAPTER 1288 BY TRANSFERRING THE SUM OF NINETY THREE THOUSAND (\$93,000) DOLLARS TO THE APPROPRIATION CONTAINED THEREIN FOR WATER FUND-TAXES, ITEM 3.

Approved May 6, 1960

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1288 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence as approved September 18, 1959, and entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$39,301,585.32 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1960", as amended, is hereby further amended by transferring the sum of Ninety Three Thousand (\$93,000) Dollars to WATER FUND-TAXES, ITEM 3.

SECTION 2. The said sum of Ninety Three Thousand (\$93,000) Dollars shall be obtained by transferring a like amount from WATER FUND-PAYMENT TO SINKING FUND.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.



That the Mayor be, and he hereby is, authorized to execute for and in behalf of the City of Providence an easement running to the City of Cranston, a municipal corporation created by an act of the General Assembly, over and across Lot 116, as shown on Plat Card 10 of the Cranston Tax Assessors, for the purpose of installing and maintaining a sanitary sewer subject to certain conditions and as provided in the accompanying draft of said easement and plan attached thereto which are made a part hereof by reference and which contain a more particular description of the location of said easement.

RESOLUTION

OF THE

CITY COUNCIL

authorizing the Mayor to execute an easement running to the City of Cranston over a strip of land in Cranston owned by the City of Providence and used for water supply purposes.

Mr. Weyler (City request)

CITY OF PROVIDENCE, a municipal corporation created by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island, hereinafter called the grantor, in consideration of One Dollar and other good and valuable consideration to it paid by the CITY OF CRANSTON, a municipal corporation created by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island, hereinafter called the grantee, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby give, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said grantee, their heirs and assigns forever, an easement or right-of-way for the purpose of installing and maintaining a sanitary sewer in a strip or parcel of land in the City of Cranston owned by the City of Providence and located southeasterly of New London Avenue, a public highway in said City of Cranston, and bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the southwesterly boundary line of lot numbered 116 owned by the City of Providence and shown on City of Cranston Assessors Card numbered 10, said point being six hundred ninety two and 71/100 (692.71) feet southeasterly of a granite bound at the intersection of the southwesterly boundary line of said lot and the northeasterly boundary line of Sockanosset Crossroad so called, thence northeasterly making an interior angle of $60^{\circ}-00'-00''$ a distance of fifty-seven and 73/100 (57.73) feet to the northeasterly boundary line of said lot, thence southeasterly making an interior angle of $120^{\circ}-00'-00''$ along the northeasterly boundary line of said lot a distance of forty and 41/100 (40.41) feet, said course bounding on land now or formerly owned by Harold V. Pride and wife Betty S. as joint tenants, thence southwesterly making an interior angle of $60^{\circ}-00'-00''$ a distance of fifty seven and 73/100 (57.73) feet to the southwesterly boundary line of said lot, said course being parallel to and thirty-five and 00/100 (35.00) feet distant from the first mentioned course, thence northwesterly making an interior angle of $120^{\circ}-00'-00''$ a distance of forty and 41/100 (40.41) feet along the southwesterly boundary line of said lot to the point of beginning, said course being parallel to and fifty and 00/100 (50.00) feet distant from the second mentioned course and bounding on land now or formerly owned by Garden City Builders, Inc., the whole being a part of that parcel of land described in a deed from John C. Harris et al to the City of Providence dated December 30, 1870 and recorded in Deed Book 51 at page 461 in the office of the Recorder of Deeds in the City of Cranston, R. I., and further delineated in a plat entitled "City of Providence - Water Supply Board - Proposed Basement Across Lot No. 116, Southeasterly of New London Avenue, Cranston, R. I." dated April 18, 1960, attached hereto and made a part of this deed.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the City of Providence does hereby reserve unto itself, its successors and assigns, the right to, at any time, obstruct said easement or right-of-way for the purpose of inspecting, installing, repairing and maintaining its pipe line or lines located thereon.

Said grantee by their acceptance of this deed do hereby, for themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, covenant to and with said grantor, its successors and assigns, that no sewer pipe line or lines will be installed across or under said easement or right-of-way until a plan and profile showing the construction of the proposed sewer pipe line or lines shall have been submitted to and approved by the Water Supply Board of the City of Providence or such other agency of said City of Providence as at the time has the control and administration of the Water Department of the City of Providence, and that said grantee will keep such sewer pipe line or lines in good order and repair at all times at the expense of said grantee, and shall not construct or erect any building or structure upon said easement or right-of-way which would in any way obstruct or prevent the grantor from inspecting, installing, repairing and maintaining its pipe line or lines located thereon.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, said City of Providence has caused this instrument to be executed and its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed by Walter H. Reynolds, its Mayor, hereunto duly authorized by a resolution adopted by the City Council of the City of Providence.




Whereas,

THAT the City Council of the City of Providence hereby orders the assessment and collection of a tax on the ratable real estate and tangible personal property and ratable intangible personal property (the tax on ratable intangible property to be at the rate of forty cents on each one hundred dollars of the value thereof) in a sum not less than \$26,300,000 nor more than \$27,500,000; said tax is for ordinary expenses, charges and sinking funds, for the payment of interest and indebtedness in whole or in part of said City, and for other purposes authorized by law.

The City Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on the inhabitants and ratable property of said City as of the 31st day of December, A.D. 1959, at twelve o'clock, noon, Eastern Standard Time according to law, and shall, on completion of said assessment, date and sign the same, and shall make out and certify to the City Collector of the City of Providence, on or before the 15th day of June, A.D. 1960, a complete list of the names of the persons taxed and of the total value of all the real estate taxes to each person, also the amount of personal estate assessed against each person, and also the total amount of the tax assessed against each person on said real estate and personal estate, opposite the name of the person or persons assessed, the assessment of real estate and of personal estate to appear in separate columns in said list. Said tax shall be due and payable on and between the 1st day of October, next and the twenty-fourth day of October, A.D. 1960, next, and all taxes remaining unpaid on said last named day shall carry until collected a penalty at the rate of eight per centum per annum upon such unpaid taxes. Provided, however, said tax may be paid in four installments, the first installment of twenty-five per centum on or before the twenty-fourth day of October, A.D. 1960, and the remaining installments as follows: Twenty-five per centum on the twenty-fourth day of January, A.D. 1961; Twenty-five per centum on the twenty-fourth day of April, A.D. 1961; and twenty-five per centum on the twenty-fourth day of July, A.D. 1961. Each installment of taxes, if paid on or before the last day of

each installment period successively and in order, shall be free from any charge for interest. If the first installment or any succeeding installment of taxes is not paid by the last date of the respective installment period or periods as they occur, then the whole tax or remaining unpaid balance of the tax, as the case may be, shall immediately become due and payable and shall carry until collected a penalty at the rate of eight percentum per annum. The City Collector, shall by advertisement, in the public newspapers of the City, notify all persons assessed to pay their respective taxes at his office on and between the said 1st and twenty-fourth days of October, A.D. 1960, both days inclusive; said Collector shall attend daily during said periods, Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays excepted, at his office from nine o'clock A.M. to five o'clock P.M. to receive said taxes.

Resolved,

That the City Treasurer acting under the direction of the Committee on Finance be and hereby is authorized and directed to borrow from time to time, in such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding One Hundred Thirty Five Thousand (\$135,000) Dollars, in accordance with the provisions of Title 45 Chapter 31-33 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956 entitled "Redevelopment act of 1956" particularly Title 45-32-42, 45-33-1, 45-33-4 and 45-33-17, and to issue the City's notes therefor, signed by him and countersigned by the Mayor and the Chairman of the Committee on Finance, and to renew any such notes from time to time as the sums become due. The money thus obtained shall be used exclusively for the preparation of plans and the making of surveys to determine whether or not that certain area known as the Mashapaug Pond District and bounded generally by Cranston Street, Niantic Avenue, the rivulet connecting Mashapaug Pond and Spectacle Pond, Mashapaug Pond and the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railroad is eligible for redevelopment within the provisions and meaning of the aforesaid "Redevelopment act of 1956".

And Be It Further Resolved, that the City Treasurer and the City Controller of the City of Providence are hereby authorized and directed to establish a special account within the Capital Funds, entitled "Mashapaug Pond" for the disbursement of said funds in accordance with the provisions herewith.

Any sums hired under this authority shall be paid over when necessary to the account established herein, and all or any part thereof shall be paid over to the Providence Redevelopment Agency upon its request for the foregoing purposes. Any sums not expended for the purposes herein authorized shall revert to the Slum Clearance and Redevelopment II Capital Account.
