Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1971-38 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, as approved June 23, 1971, entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$71,942,933.24 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 1971 and Ending June 30, 1972", as amended, is hereby further amended by appropriating the sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$250,000) Dollars to SCHOOL DEPARTMENT, 71-01, for the following Items:

ITEM 5	-	115,000.00

SECTION 2. The said sum of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$250,000) Dollars as thus added and appropriated shall be obtained by authorizing and directing the City Controller and City Treasurer to transfer Two Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$250,000) Dollars from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account to the Receipt Account.

SECTION 3. The estimated receipts from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account are hereby increased by Two Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$250,000) Dollars.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

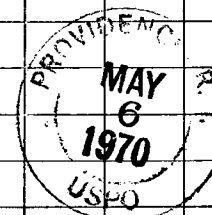

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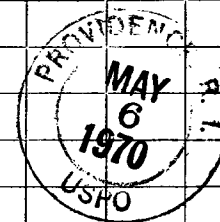

Gentlemen:

This petition, from the Committee on Ordinances, requests a change in zoning from R-3 to M-1 on Lots 204, 205 and 206 in Assessor's Plat 54 located on the easterly side of Eddy Street.

Inspection revealed that Lot 206 contains a 2 1/2-story frame dwelling in very poor condition. Lots 204 and 205 are vacant and unimproved. The surrounding neighborhood is mixed commercial, industrial and very poor quality residential.

Under the present zoning, these three lots are on the border line of an industrial (M-1) zone. Under the proposed zoning plan all three lots are shown as ML-2 (light manufacturing).

The proposed plan makes a realistic assessment of conditions in this area.

Attached is the recommendation of The Model Cities Director concerning the proposed change.

"Referral number 1761 - The change from R-3 general residence to M-1 general industrial zone is not in conflict with Model Cities Plans or the City Master Plan and as such we have no objection to the change."

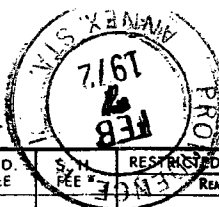

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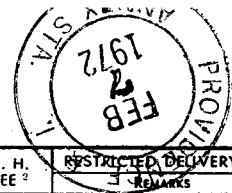

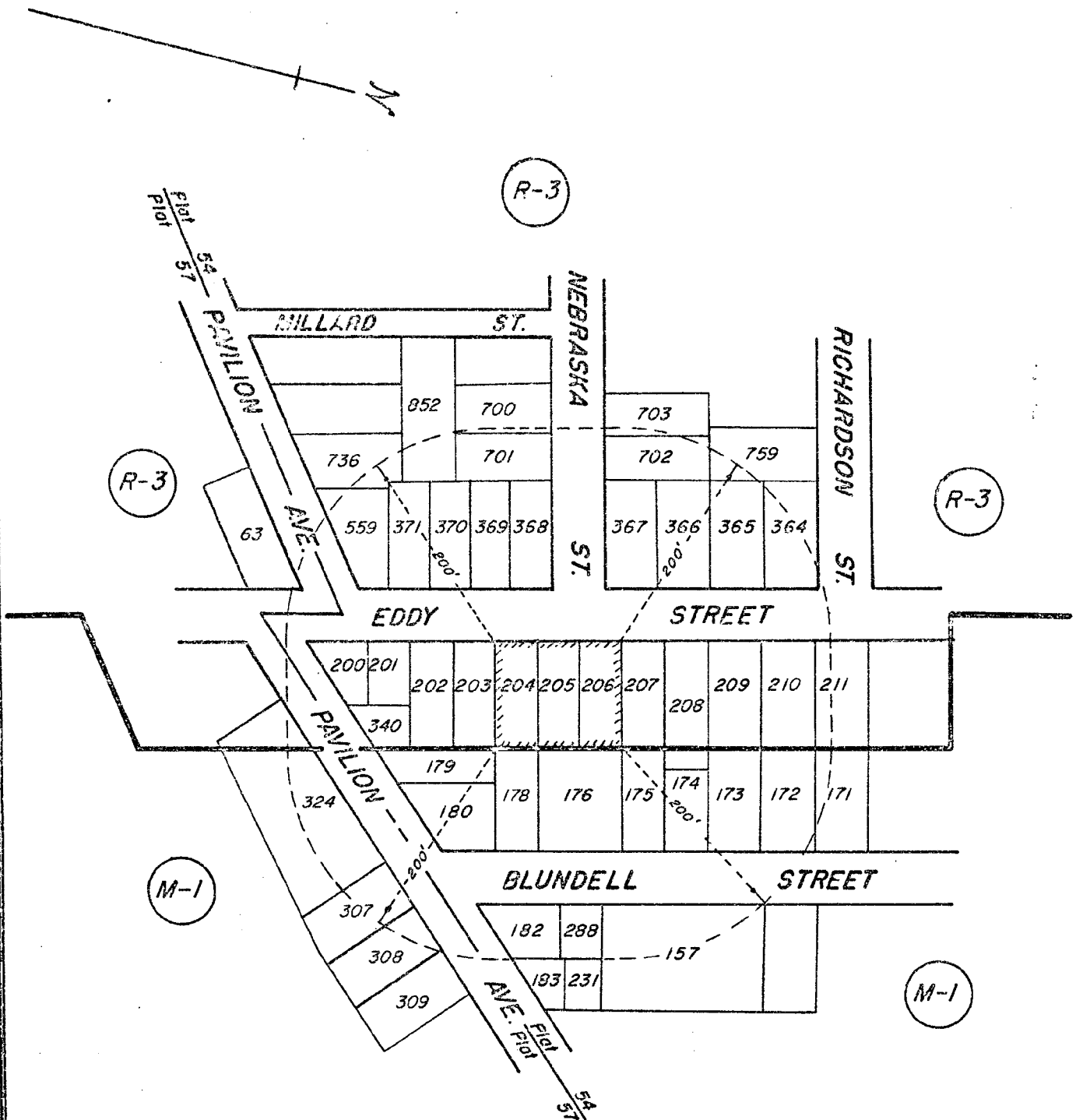

Approved April 10, 1972

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. No petition to the Zoning Board of Review for an appeal, special exception, or variance, shall be accepted by the Secretary of the Zoning Board of Review, unless accompanied by a filing fee of Thirty-Five (\$35.00) Dollars, which shall be deposited with the City Collector, and no part of which shall be returnable to the petitioner.

Section 2. That portion of Chapter 70-12 of the Code of Ordinances, approved March 23, 1970, being a further Amendment of Section 102 of Chapter 544 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved September 21, 1951, and entitled, "An Ordinance Zoning the City of Providence and Establishing Use, Height and Area Regulations", as amended, insofar as said portion provides for a filing fee of Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars for petitions to the said Board for an appeal, special exception, or variance, is hereby repealed.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
