No. 346 AN ORDINANCE IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 4 BY AMENDING SECTION 4-34.1 WHICH IS ENTITLED: "PROOF OF OWNERSHIP REQUIRED PRIOR TO IMPOUNDING DOG"

Approved June 6, 1982

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended by amending Section 4-34.1, which shall read as follows:

"Section 4-34.1. Proof of Ownership Required Prior to Impounding Dog.

(A) Anyone attempting to commit or have detained or impounded any dog or cat to a police officer, dog officer or any other individuals authorized by the city to exercise such control must first sign an affidavit that he or she is the true owner of said animal.

(B) The dog officer shall charge a fee, as specified in the following schedule, to be paid by said owner of any dog or cat taken to the dog pound for the purpose of transferring title or for disposal according to law.

FEE SCHEDULE:

- \$5.00 for each adult (6 months or older) dog
\$5.00 for each adult (6 months or older) cat
\$5.00 for each kitten or puppy."

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
