No. 120 **AN ORDINANCE** IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 2 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE ENTITLED "ELECTIONS"

Approved February 22, 1985

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION I. Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence entitled "Elections" is hereby amended by adding thereto Section 2-302 which shall read as follows:

"Section 2-302. Polling Place Maps at Polling Places. The Board of Canvassers shall cause to be posted at each polling place in each ward of the City of Providence throughout the hours of voting at any general or special election in the City of Providence a map showing each polling place in said ward and the geographic dimensions of and streets within each of said ward's voting districts, all in a manner sufficient to notify residents of each such ward of the polling place at which said residents vote."

SECTION II. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
